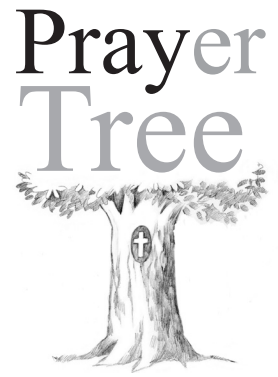

## EcoJustice Ministry Catholic Social Teaching on Climate Change: Poverty

According to the US Bishops, three principles underlie the Catholic response to climate change: prudence, the common good and poverty. What they say specifically about poverty and climate change: "... any successful strategy must also reflect the genuine participation and concerns of those most affected and least able to bear the burdens ... [this] is a moral and political necessity ..."

It is clear that the poor will be disproportionately affected by climate change. While rich nations will have resources to help mitigate the impacts of climate change, poor nations will not. And yet, unjustly, poor nations have contributed little, if anything, to the greenhouse gas emissions altering our ecosystem.
