Fr. Gary Smith, S.J.—known to many in St. Joseph for his books, Radical Compassion and They Come Back Singing—returned this last year to Africa and to the work of Jesuit Refugee Services, where he had been for several years. He had originally joined JRS in his mid-60's, after years of working with men and women on the streets of Tacoma and Portland. He wanted, he said, to be with people even more on the edge, and so answered a call to serve with the refugees of Sudan, first in Rhino Camp and later in northern Uganda, along the Nile. After returning from another tour with JRS-this time in South Africa among those fleeing the persecutions of Zimbabwe—Gary had anticipated remaining in the United States, since he had struggled with health concerns and was now nearing 75. But, soon, the desire to serve led him back to Africa, and last year he was sent, with JRS, to the newly formed (and deeply challenged) nation of South Sudan. Loving the people, which has always been the center of his ministry, Gary soon immersed himself in the life of Juba (the city where he was living), having occasional contact with another Northwest Jesuit, Fr. Mike Schultheis, who was working in the same city helping the local Church to establish a university.

This week, however, Gary sent this message to his Jesuit brothers in the United States: As you know the mess in South Sudan continues. There were nights of shooting and killing. I did not sleep much. I was going to stay but, on Friday, the chancellor of the University, Mathew Taban, a South Sudanese priest, good man, thought it would be best if I left on the final evacuation plane provided by the American Embassy. He thought things would get worse and the airport might be closed indefinitely. And where I lived would be vulnerable. He would worry. So I write this from Nairobi, with the Jesuit community, somewhat beaten up but okay. The trip out of the Juba airport would

be worth another book. I will wait it out during the holidays and see what happens.

As we move towards the end of this year, well into the third millennium of the Christian era, we might do well to pause for a moment and see the world. But, for a change, not through the eyes of great leaders or great villains, not through the lens of Presidents or Bishops, of terrorists or political operatives, not through the interpretations of Fox News or MSNBC. See it through the eyes and heart of one disciple, driven into exile by yet another civil war, hoping only to return to the people who have his heart and to the mission of Christ that draws him to love them and to bring them the love that is their birthright. For this is the, indeed, the call of the Church today—our call, given us in the words and actions of Pope Francis and in the grace of the Spirit that rises up from the places of oppression and war, violence and anguish, alienation and anxiety. It is a call that rejects the old dichotomies and the egoistic divisions, that rejects the ideological hatred fueled by deformed religiosity and unreflective legalism. The call of the Church today stands opposed to the crushing injustice and violence built on the lies of national security and economic inevitability. It is a call, empowered by the Holy Spirit, which proclaims that tomorrow need not be what yesterday has been, but can be something new, if we choose to make it so.

It is easy to believe that change is impossible: that we are doomed to live in a world marked by loneliness and war, by hatred and empty-hearted moralizing, by a God who is distant and slow in coming. Yet, in the teaching of Pope Francis (whose election, itself, seems an intrusion of the Holy Spirit into our year), we are reminded again of the foundational message of Christ. A message of love unfolding in new ways and of God's absolute and irrevocable choice to love us. This is a message that overwhelms the clericalism and legalism of Church bureaucrats, the message that undoes the plundering greed of those who trade in human misery. This is the message that opens the gates for those to whom fear has become a prison and a political posture; that nurtures the heart with hope, and strengthens the back for service.

Let us, therefore, close 2013 aware that our world is broken in many ways, but convinced that it is redeemed in even more. Today we may sit with Gary Smith, as exiles for the sake of the kingdom, but let us "wait it out during the holidays and see what happens." With God's grace, with our courage, with the example of the old and the energy of the young, with the fullness of love as our inheritance, let us be confident and filled with hope. **God is making all things new!** In 2014, may God, through us, change the world.
