First Reading

Genesis 18:20-32

In those days, the LORD said: "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great, and their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry against them that comes to me. I mean to find out."

While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my LORD, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?" He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

St. Patrick Parish to Merge with St. Joseph



As many of you already knew, our neighbors at St. Patrick Parish have been preparing for their parish to be closed due to parish restructuring decisions made by the Archdiocese. After months of discussions and discernment, a plurality of St. Patrick's parishioners communicated to the Archdiocese that they would prefer to merge with St. Joseph. On July 8th, the Archbishop issued an official decree stating that St. Pat's will be merged into St. Joe's on September 1st, 2022. Most importantly, we are eager to welcome the people of St. Pat's into our community. Throughout this process, we have been in constant communication with clergy and lay leadership at St. Patrick's, and have plans in place to integrate former St. Pat's parishioners into the Pastoral and Mission Council, as well as other commissions and committees. We are also preparing accommodations to allow the deaf/deaf-blind community, which has been such an integral part of St. Patrick's, to feel at home in their new parish.

We look forward to experiencing the gifts of the St. Patrick Parish community in a merger guided by love and inclusion.
