

Welcome St. Pat's Parishioners!

This weekend, we officially welcome parishioners who've chosen to attend St. Joe's as we complete the merger of St. Patrick Parish into St. Joseph Parish. We hope you feel welcome here, and we look forward to incorporating your gifts and the wonderful spirit of St. Pat's into this new home.

As part of the transition, St. Pat's has brought their St. Patrick statue, chrism oils, and processional cross. A brief history of the cross:

St. Patrick's Processional Cross was designed and crafted by Sister Paula Turnball SNJM. As a professional sculptor, Sister Paula spent her lifetime expressing her faith through stone, brick, wood, and metal. Her works grace many churches, public spaces, and private collections throughout the United States. She designed St. Patrick's Processional Cross using the structure of a Celtic Cross. The image of the Resurrected Body of Christ is hand carved in oak and framed in Italian glass. Each piece of the tile work is unique using multi colors of blues and greens. Sister Paula made this Processional Cross as a companion piece to her large Celtic Cross that resides in St. Patrick's sanctuary. The larger cross is such that visually the Processional Cross would insert its design into the center of the larger cross. They are both original works of art and one-of-a-kind. For over 30 years, these two beloved pieces have been cherished by the community of St. Pats.





Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."


Wake, my heart, sing, my voice.














Parish Life
