Ministry of the Week: High School Youth Group



Guided by our new Campus Minister Samantha Barger (nee Samantha Yanity), the Youth Group exists to create a safe space for high schoolers to connect with each other, build friendships, find ways to serve their community, and grow in faith.

Once a month, we will schedule a youth-led liturgy at the 5:30pm Sunday Mass. This Mass will involve high school-age lectors, cantors, ushers, and musicians. After the Mass, we will gather in the Parish Center from 6:30pm - 8:00pm for social time and some spiritual and formative conversation.

In addition to the Sunday high school gatherings, the parish will host 1-2 activities for the group each month. These activities will be guided by the high schooler's suggestions.

We have 3 events planned so far for this fall:

Saturday, October 22nd from 7:00 pm-9:00 pm in the Parish Center, we will be having a movie night. Bring your favorite Halloween snack to share!

Sunday, October 30th after the 5:30pm Mass, we will be having an All Saints/All Hollows Eve (Halloween) themed youth gathering from 6:30-8:00pm. The first half will cover the history of Halloween (Catholic history), and the second half will be a pumpkin carving contest! You're welcome to bring any pumpkin-carving supplies and your favorite Halloween snacks to share.

We will have a high school planning meeting on Wednesday, November 16th, 6:30pm-7:30pm. This will be an opportunity for them to plan out what activities they would like to participate in for the coming year.

We love having parent volunteers and we absolutely need your support to get this off the ground and have a successfully running youth group! If you think you can help out with some of our outings, please let us know!





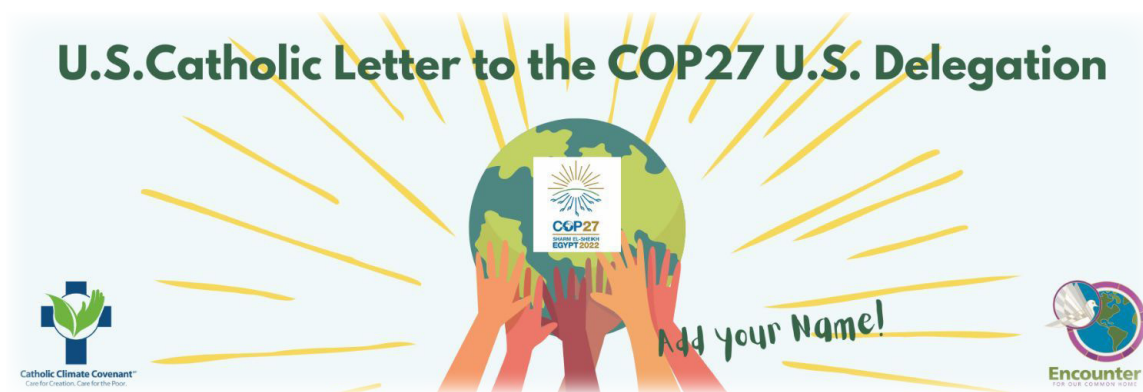


Discerning Deacons: Join the St. Phoebe School for Synodality

Over a series of months in the St. Phoebe School for Synodality, you'll learn how to assemble a team of allies, have strategic conversations with church leaders and other decision-makers, design and facilitate synodal discernment sessions in your parish or community around the issue of women and the diaconate, and report the fruits of your discernment through the synodal structures in the Church in preparation to bear witness to that discernment collectively in September 2023.
