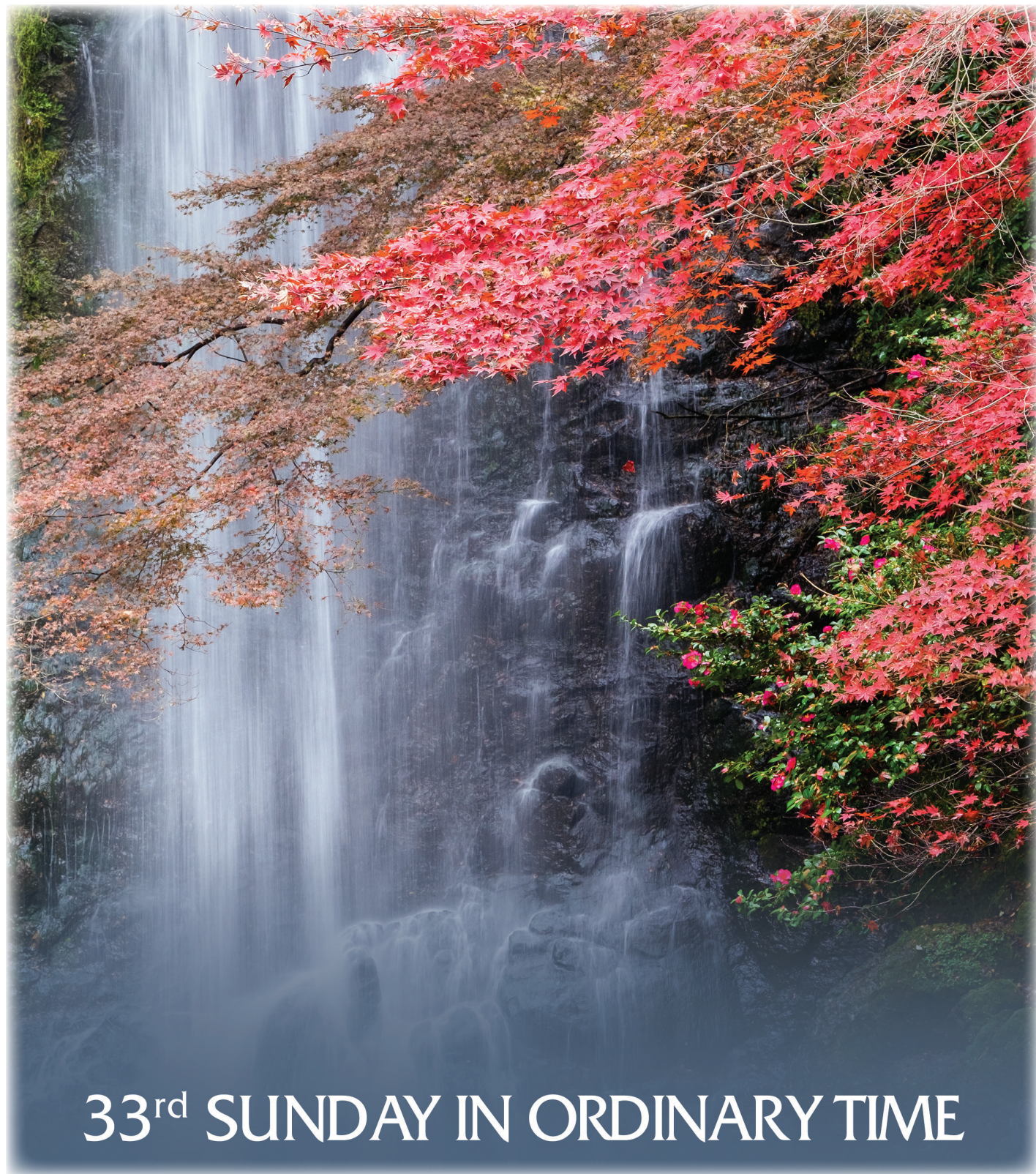

Ministry of the Week: Sister Parish



San Bartolome, Arcatao, El Salvador

For over 30 years, the Sister Parish relationship between St. Joseph's and San Bartolome parish has grown and sprouted into many different partnerships. This relationship began in the midst of El Salvadoran civil war and now finds us in the midst of mass emigration and the need for local economic opportunity.

St. Joe's sponsors the DHP scholarship program, providing students from rural areas of El Salvador an often out-of-reach opportunity to deepen themselves through higher education at the universities in the capital of San Salvador. Last year, the parish donated funds to purchase a house in San Salvador for the students!

This spring, the parish plans to send a delegation (open to all) to El Salvador, tentatively the week of March 19, 2023, to visit San Bartolome, reviving a tradition of visiting in solidarity that was paused due to COVID. 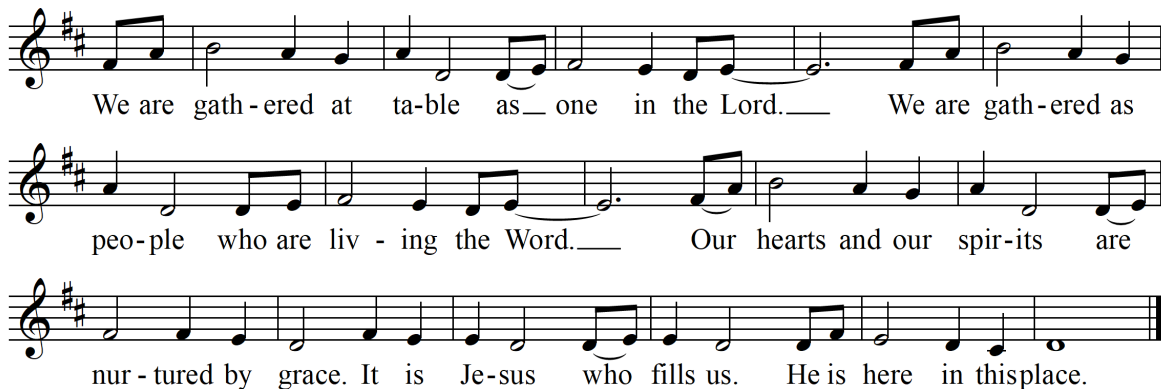
ALL ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD

What is a Land Acknowledgement?

Land acknowledgement is a traditional custom dating back centuries for many Native communities and nations. For non-Indigenous communities, land acknowledgement is a powerful way of showing respect and honoring the Indigenous Peoples of the land on which we work and live. Acknowledgement is a simple way of resisting the erasure of Indigenous histories and working towards honoring and inviting the truth. (Wording from www.duwamishtribe.org)

In making a land acknowledgement, we hope to take a small step in the process of reconciliation, honoring the land and Indigenous presence on this land for over 10,000 years.



Parish Land Acknowledgement

St. Joseph Parish and School sits on the traditional and ancestral land of the Coast Salish and Duwamish People, the original inhabitants of what is now known as Seattle and the Puget Sound area. We pay respect to the people of the Coast Salish and Duwamish, past and present, and honor the land itself which remains sacred to the Coast Salish and Duwamish People.

We acknowledge that these peoples, and many others, were forcefully removed from their land, some abducted & sent to boarding schools, and some murdered, often with the implicit and explicit support of the Catholic Church and the Jesuit Order. We acknowledge these sins and recognize that the consequences of these actions continue to affect these Indigenous communities.

As a Jesuit parish, Ignited by the Eucharist to Love and Serve, we know we cannot be faithful to our mission without changing our relationship to the Indigenous peoples of this land. We are committed to supporting the Indigenous members of our community as we educate ourselves (a largely non-Native parish) on Indigenous histories, cultures, and issues. We pledge to build deeper relationships with the Duwamish, Coast Salish, and other Indigenous stewards of this land and to work to repair the injustices of colonization.
