

You may have heard of Facing Homelessness, our partners in the U-District who serve our unhoused neighbors every day with essentials like warm food, warm clothes, and someone to talk to. Have you considered getting involved, either by donating or volunteering? It's a rewarding experience for families, individuals, and couples!

Facing Homelessness relies on donations from St. Joe's to stock the Window of Kindness, their direct outreach ministry to houseless neighbors.

The Window of Kindness is a physical place of connection between community members and people experiencing homelessness. The healing power of listening and connecting extends to everyone who participates.

At the window, our volunteers hand out thousands of socks, gloves, snacks, sleeping bags, and other supplies essential to staying dry and warm. But people often come for a cup of hot chocolate, conversation, and a listening ear. Everything we give is a vehicle for kindness and human connection. Every connection is a reminder that we all live better when we feel loved.



The LORD said to Moses: "Speak to Aaron and his sons and tell them: This is how you shall bless the Israelites. Say to them:


The LORD bless you and keep you!
