A Note from Fr. Chris



Dear Friends,

There are many ways to describe Jesus' teaching and his purpose and meanings. I like to summarize it this way: Jesus was urging us to change, to be different. In Greek the word is "metanoia." It literally means to change the direction you are going.

Now this is not about a physical, geographical u-turn! The change of direction is about what we are doing with our minds and hearts. The directional change Jesus has in mind concerns things like: how we tend to judge others by the color of their skin and the religion they practice and politics they espouse and who they love and how they dress and who they spend their time with and what they read and how much money they appear to have and their age or their youth and what music they like... well, you get the picture!

This Lenten season is a good time to change; at least to try to change. It seems a worthy project to want to be a better person on Easter Sunday than I was on Ash Wednesday. I know I can't do it without God's grace and love, so I ask for it. I also know it can't happen without me wanting it and making, however small or large, a commitment to the project.

I think Jesus teaches change because he believes it benefits everyone. Every act of kindness spreads a special and necessary grace into many lives. Like the stone that drops into the pool, the ripples spread outward in all directions. There is that word again: direction; must be important.

Metanoia - check yourself; what way are you going?

On this feast of St. Joseph (March 19) blessings everyone!





1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

The LORD said to Samuel: "Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen my king from among his sons."

As Jesse and his sons came to the sacrifice, Samuel looked at Eliab and thought, "Surely the LORD's anointed is here before him." But the LORD said to Samuel: "Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the LORD looks into the heart." In the same way Jesse presented seven sons before Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any one of these." Then Samuel asked Jesse, "Are these all the sons you have?" They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints. the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen








ALL ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD

Sister Parish Delegation


June 26th - July 6th




MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD

St. Joe's Asylum Accompaniment Team



Did you know? St. Joe's is sponsoring an asylum-seeker from Nicaragua! Alvaro Vargas arrived in El Paso, Texas, in December of 2022, with nothing but the clothes on his back, after walking from Nicaragua, through Mexico, to the border of the United States. Joe Cotton, Director of Pastoral Care and Outreach at the Archdiocese, has known Alvaro since he was 13 years old and a participant of NPH, and got him on a flight to Seattle and a place to stay.

Since then, a group of St. Joe's parishioners has formed a Welcome Circle for Alvaro, supporting him with basic necessities like clothing and transportation, as well as helping him find an attorney and healthcare. Leading this team are parishioners who have experience with the immigration system: Chris McNabb, Gretchen Brennan, and Dave Zablotny. Anyone is welcome to join the team! Just email Mark at markp@stjosephparish.org if you'd like to help.

Alvaro is fleeing violence in his home country and a complete lack of economic opportunities, but he is still trying to support his wife and four children in Nicaragua. He is unable to work right now due to his immigration status, so we are hoping to raise enough funds over the next few months to rent his own personal living space, as well as pay for his attorney fees, which can be upwards of \$10,000.
