# A Note From Fr. Chris: A Better Man



In the movie *As Good As it Gets,* the character played by Jack Nicholson, Melvin Udall, a shut-in, obsessive-compulsive novelist who offends nearly everyone nearly all the time, says to an astonished waitress (played by Helen Hunt): "You make me want to be a better man."

I don't know why that quote came to my mind this morning in my prayer. I found myself thinking: isn't that a good description of what it is like to be close to Christ. The apostles grew to be better men because they spent time with Christ. Generations of women and men who have spent time with Christ grew to become better people. Some of them we have called Saints.

"You make me want to be a better man." To be honest, that thought is not at the forefront of my mind when I come to the church on Sunday morning. But I would say that it is what I would hope would be the result of my being with the people and the prayers and the praise and the worship of Jesus Christ. On Sunday mornings and many other times during the week, any time I spend with Christ I trust is going to be good for me. And I believe I could say to Jesus "You make me want to be a better man."

I think of it this way: the reason I am Catholic, a priest, a Jesuit, a Christian - I need Jesus Christ to do for me what I cannot do for myself. Christ can make me holy; Christ can make me better than I can make or become on my own.

Here is a simple prayer: "Jesus, make me a better person."



First Reading Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do, my brothers?" Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call." He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

Beloved: If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps.

He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.

When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.




Says the Lord, "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep, and mine know me."

Gospel John 10:1-10

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."









**Friday, May 5th** - Anointing Mass at 11:30 am followed by a delicious lunch! Join us for some Cinco de Mayo fun!


