A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

The thing is: Peter walked on water! We forget that. The gospel story clearly says that Peter got out of the boat and walked toward Jesus, who was walking on water!

Admittedly the whole thing sounds crazy. Even Peter started to think: "OMG, I'm walking on water! This is crazy! People can't walk on water!" And then he started to sink, as the story goes, crying out "Lord, save me!"

None of us thinks we can walk on water, so we don't try. What Peter was thinking when he got out of the boat, we can't know, but apparently when Jesus said "come join me out here on the water" Peter just went. The result was: he walked on water; at least until he doubted.

I'm pretty sure I would have sunk had I been in Peter's place. My heart would want to follow Jesus; my head would have been thinking "this can't be happening!" It reminds me of learning to ride a bicycle. Your head is telling you the bike (and you!) can't stay upright without someone holding it up; but with some pedaling and some daring – away you go and your head is now thinking: "I'm riding the bike!" (A very proud moment for both child and parent.)

Belief with a bit of daring can get you somewhere. Why we don't try it more often I cannot say but I do wonder (at myself and others) why we seem to have a hard time putting our trust and belief in God, in Jesus. It makes me wonder: if I'm going to go ahead and believe in Jesus why don't I go all the way and believe in Jesus' possibilities rather than my limitations.


Learn More About Partners in the Gospel


THE NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel Matthew 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost, " they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.



I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.












ALL ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD


