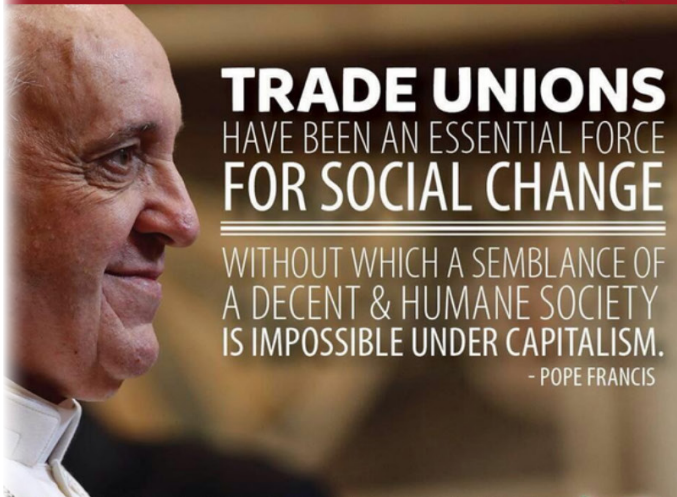

A Message from Fr. Chris: *Partners in the Gospel*

Dear Friends,

A year ago St. Joseph Parish grew when members of St. Patrick Parish made the pilgrimage to join our community. Their spiritual home for many years was demanded to be closed; a painful and sad experience for its many members.

Their presence among us was soon felt and received as a blessing and grace. Many people have come up to me after a Mass to tell me how wonderful they feel about the new St. Pat's folks. They comment generously about the strong community that St. Pat's folks have brought us and their obvious faith and discipleship. I agree wholeheartedly. We have, all of us, been blessed and changed into a new community.

In the coming months we will find that it is very likely that our community will grow again. I hope you have been following and reading the materials available on our website concerning the *Partners in the Gospel* program. The entire Archdiocese will soon ask almost every Catholic parish to consider a new configuration. New "parish families" will be formed and we too will be in a process of consideration for joining with another parish to create a new parish family.

In a few weeks I will be able to announce to you what proposal is being made for our consultation. That may sound a bit frightening, but I hope it is thought more an opportunity. How many times does Christ say to his followers: do not be afraid. God is continuing to work in and through us. As we acknowledged a year ago - it is important for us to let God mold us and use us for the great work of salvation.

St. Ignatius Loyola reminds us: "There are very few who realize what God would make of them if they abandoned themselves entirely to His hands and let themselves be formed by His Grace."

We go forward with confidence: God is at work in us; our best desire is to fulfill the project that God has for our fulfillment and salvation.

Farmworkers will be tabling after the 9am and 11am Masses - take this chance to show your commitment to Catholic Social Teaching and stand with organized labor!

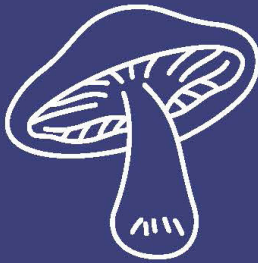

- ♦ We begin with your faith journey, your questions about the faith, and if you discover that you want baptism or full communion in the church, you will continue on in your journey toward the sacraments, but no commitment is required for the first few months of the journey.

CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION

Primary School Faith Formation Classes

Sunday School CFF classes for grades 1-6 have open registration now through late September! Classes begin mid-October and run through May, for three Sundays each month. Sign up today!

CFF 1 The first year of the Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. Children are usually in 1st grade or at a minimum, age 6. CFF 1 introduces students to scripture, prayer, Reconciliation, and Eucharist. Successful completion of CFF 1 is a requirement for CFF 2.

CFF 2 The second year of the Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. This year continues to build upon the foundation set in CFF 1. In addition to classes meeting three Sundays a month, children and parents will work through at home materials and attend workshops to prepare for Reconciliation and First Communion.

CFF 3 / 4 This class combines grades 3 and 4. Students will discuss God as Trinity, Community, Church, Sacraments, Morality, Liturgical Year, and continue to develop a relationship with God through Jesus.

CFF 5 / 6 This class combines grades 5 and 6. Students will continue to develop themselves as Catholics and reflect on how Scripture pertains to each of us today. Discussion will focus on themes from Breakthrough! The Bible for Young Catholics. Students will dedicate one year to the Old Testament and one year to the New Testament.
