

A Message from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

Partners In the Gospel asks us to consider creating one parish family with St. Therese Parish. This is a matter of discernment, which for us means we want to consider what it is that God would have us do. More specifically, because we are disciples of Jesus, the consideration for us is to wonder and to discern how we can serve God's project of redemption.

Putting it another way, our interest is not to choose what most pleases us but to respond to Jesus' request: "Go make disciples of all the nations: baptize them in the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit." [Matt 28:19]

I think what is being asked of us is to imagine how we can unite parishioners of both parishes into one body, one parish with the common goal of serving God. Looking at the task before us, I think we need one another for this holy work.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic our parish has seen a loss of active members (based on Mass attendance counts) of about 25%. Even after welcoming St. Patrick's parishioners over the past months, we are a smaller community than we were before. The hard reality is that we, like most Catholic (and Christian) churches, are shrinking. For nearly thirty years, attendance at Sunday services has been declining throughout the country and in many parts of the world.

This Sunday's gospel speaks to us of "gathering" in Jesus' name. This is the fundamental meaning of being 'church'. We do this together; we nurture in one another the memory of Jesus, the presence of Jesus, the desire of Jesus that we be one body with a single task to love one another.

Together or separately our two parishes must go forward. We have work to do. Personally, I think we need each other to be a stronger Church. Loving one another, listening to one another, walking with one another, accepting one another is the holy work God has given us. *This is God's plan for redemption; that we do it together.*

CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION

Primary School Faith Formation Classes

Sunday School CFF classes for grades 1-6 have open registration now through late September! Classes begin mid-October and run through May, for three Sundays each month. Sign up today!

CFF 1 The first year of the Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. Children are usually in 1st grade or at a minimum, age 6. CFF 1 introduces students to scripture, prayer, Reconciliation, and Eucharist. Successful completion of CFF 1 is a requirement for CFF 2.

CFF 2 The second year of the Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. This year continues to build upon the foundation set in CFF 1. In addition to classes meeting three Sundays a month, children and parents will work through at home materials and attend workshops to prepare for Reconciliation and First Communion.

CFF 3 / 4 This class combines grades 3 and 4. Students will discuss God as Trinity, Community, Church, Sacraments, Morality, Liturgical Year, and continue to develop a relationship with God through Jesus.

CFF 5 / 6 This class combines grades 5 and 6. Students will continue to develop themselves as Catholics and reflect on the how Scripture pertains to each of us today. Discussion will focus on themes from Breakthrough! The Bible

for Young Catholics. Students will dedicate one year to the Old Testament and one year to the New Testament.

Confirmation Prep - Enrolling Now!


