Have you ever been in a restaurant when the staff appear at a table near you with a cake and candles lit and they start singing "Happy Birthday to You..."? I always love how many other patrons at the restaurant join in the singing, despite not knowing the person whose birthday is being celebrated.

I ask because I'm also interested if you sing with the congregation at our Masses. It looks like some folks are impatient for the song to end so we can get on with Mass.





and the life of the world to come. Amen.



We are excited to announce that our parish has begun using Pushpay as our new giving solution. Pushpay is an industry leader known for creating an easy, secure way for to manage your own giving from the convenience of a mobile device or your computer (**gifts by check or cash won't be affected!**).

On the flyer in this bulletin, you'll find detailed instructions for how to set up new RECURRING donations, and how to cancel your current recurring donations on OSV, our previous giving platform.

Don't feel comfortable doing it yourself? **We will have volunteers after Mass to help on February 4th and February 11th!** You will have until May to move your recurring donations, but don't wait until then!

Don't have a recurring donation? No problem! Pushpay accepts **one-time donations** easily.

All the giving links on our website and the QR codes in the bulletin now automatically redirect to the Pushpay site. Just follow the link, select "Give One Time," enter an amount, and click "Next." The site will ask you to enter a phone number to sign in, but you can also give as a "guest" by clicking the "How does mobile sign in work?" button.



