

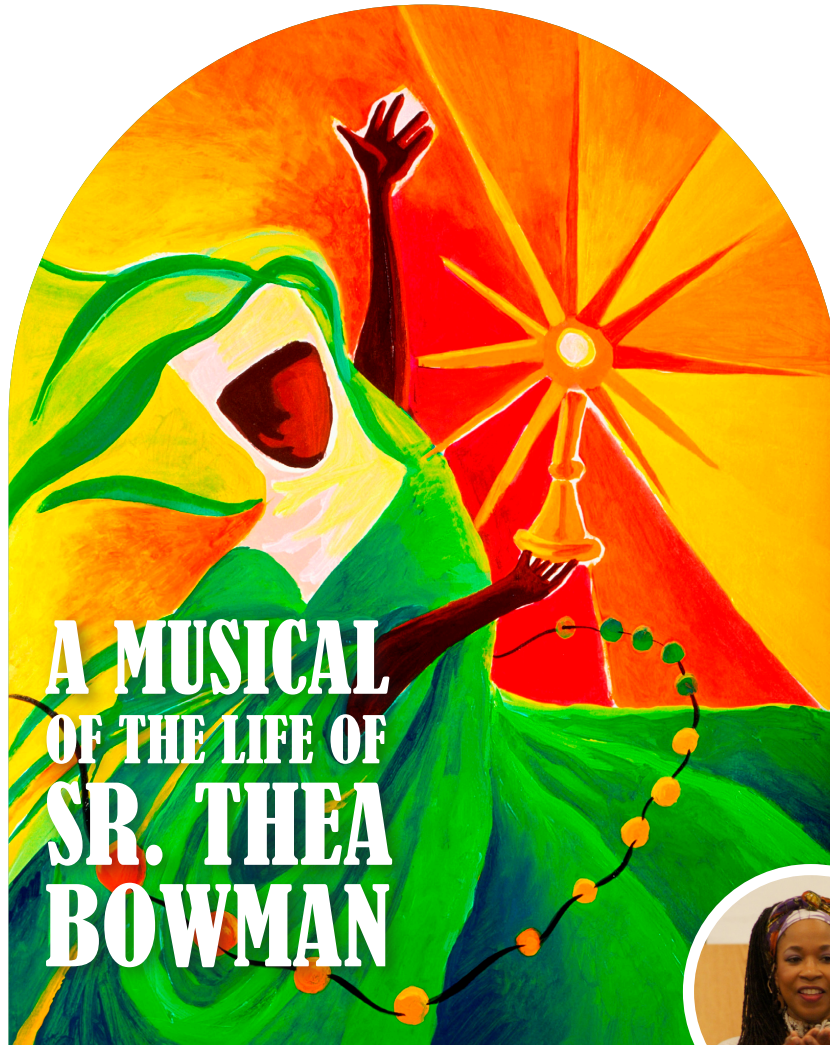

A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

As you have heard in the Mass announcements we are all invited to a dramatic, musical presentation of the life of **Sr. Thea Bowman**. It is being sponsored by our own parish, Seattle University and the Intercommunity Peace & Justice Center; held at St. Patrick's church March 1st and 2nd.

I am excited that we have this opportunity to celebrate and learn about an American, Black Catholic nun who lived in our own life-time and whose cause for canonization to sainthood is underway. Let me tell you a bit about her.

Born in 1937, in Yazoo City, Mississippi, Sister Thea shared the message of God's love through a teaching career. After 16 years at the elementary, secondary and university levels, the bishop of Jackson, Mississippi, invited her to become a consultant for intercultural awareness. Sister Thea gave presentations across the country; lively gatherings that combined singing, gospel preaching, prayer, and storytelling. Her programs were directed to break down racial and cultural barriers. She encouraged people to communicate with one another so that they could understand other cultures and races.

Sadly in 1984, Sr. Thea was diagnosed with breast cancer. She prayed "to live until I die." Sr. Thea continued her gatherings seated in a wheelchair. She lived a full life. She fought evil, especially prejudice, suspicion, hatred, and things that drive people apart. She fought for God and God's people until her death in 1990.

It is rare to have the privilege of having a 'saint' in our own life-time; many believe Sr. Thea is just that kind of person. I encourage everyone to come to the musical portrayal of Sr. Thea's life. Our own choir members and folks from St. Theresa's are featured. Professional actor and playwright, ValLimar Jansen will play the role of Sr. Thea and local actors are featured in the cast. Come see this story of an inspiring woman and future saint.
