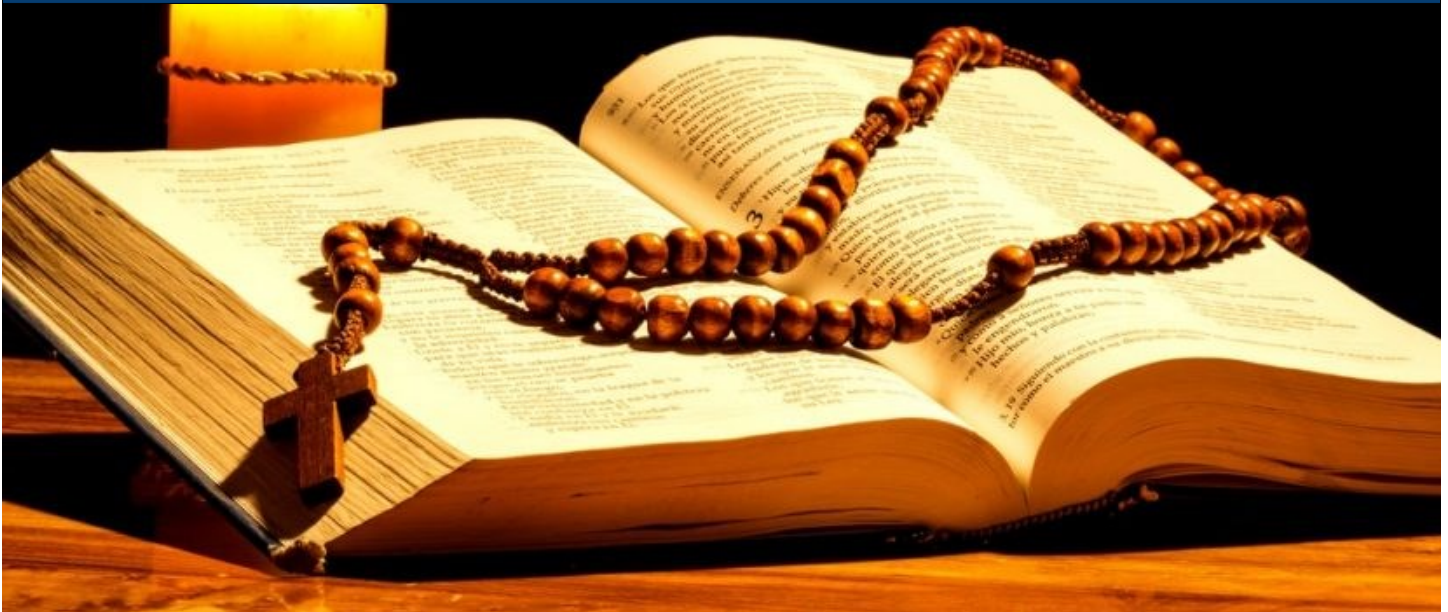


The St. Joe's Easter Egg Hunt is back! Everyone is invited to join in the fun after the 9am Mass.
