A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

Today is the 2nd Sunday of Easter and we will celebrate four more as we move towards the Sundays of Ascension and Pentecost.

Lent and Easter day are behind us; before we get too far from those days, I want to express some gratitude.

Let's think back to Ash Wednesday and the 1st Sunday of Lent. Remember how the church décor was changed: purple lighting and vestments, banners and symbols removed from the walls, the music was chosen to reflect our period of renewal, reconciliation and return to our love for God. Did you notice on Palm Sunday the crown of thorns hanging over the center aisle?

Notice the church decoration today: beautiful banners draped on either side of the altar mosaic, bright lights illuminate the altar, flowers and white vestments, bright music and song fills our hearts and church building. The pool of blessed baptismal water stands before our altar and the Paschal Candle shine brightly next to the ambo (the podium for the scripture lessons).

We are all aware that everything mentioned above required much planning, many hands at work, rehearsals and preparation to accomplish the beauty and grace of our liturgical celebrations. I am not able to write here the names of all the folks who had a part in our Lent and Easter liturgies. Some of the good folks are named in our bulletin, the Pastoral Staff. There are many, many more unnamed folks who served through the two seasons and I want to let them know that I am so very grateful for them. Let us all show gratitude during this Easter season!

We can each of us thank our ushers, musicians/singers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, clergy, leaders of prayer and study groups, and don't forget the most important ones who clean up after us!!! THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE can be said to all these wonderful parishioners. They are all around us – decorating not only our church but our lives!!!

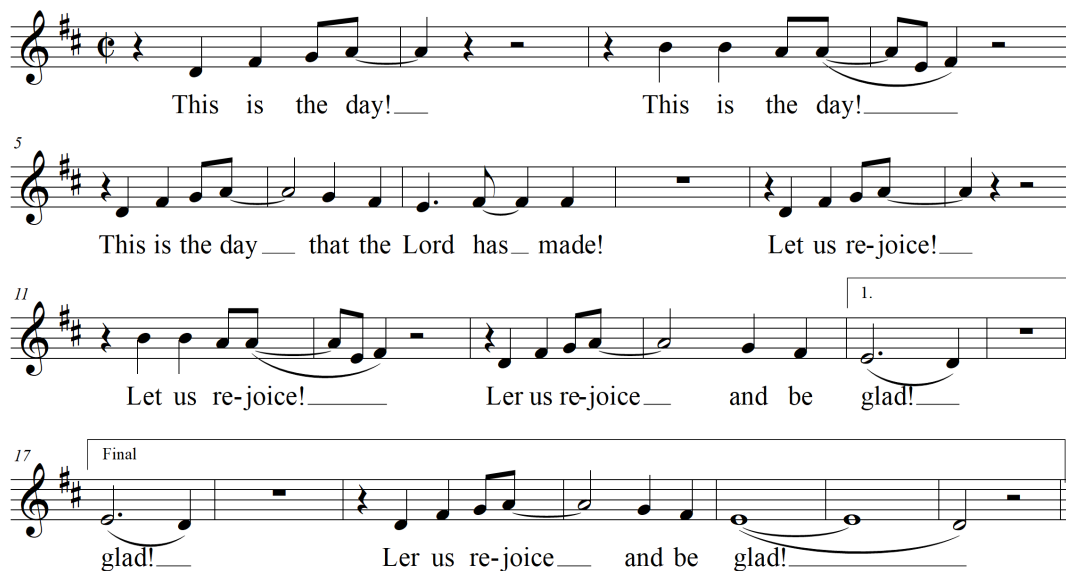
Acts 4:32-35

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

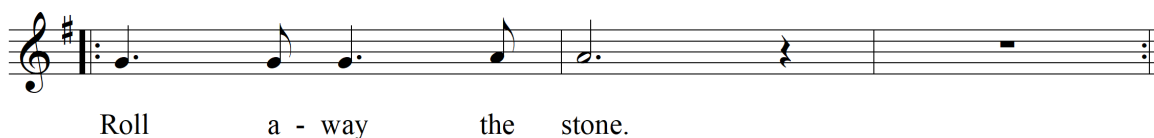

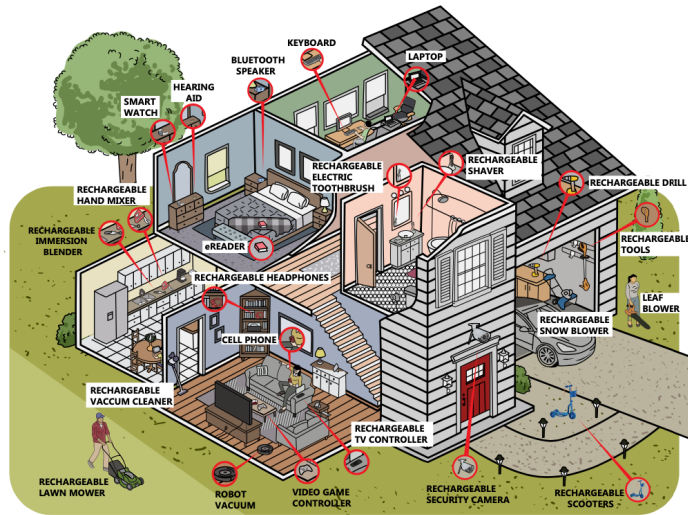
