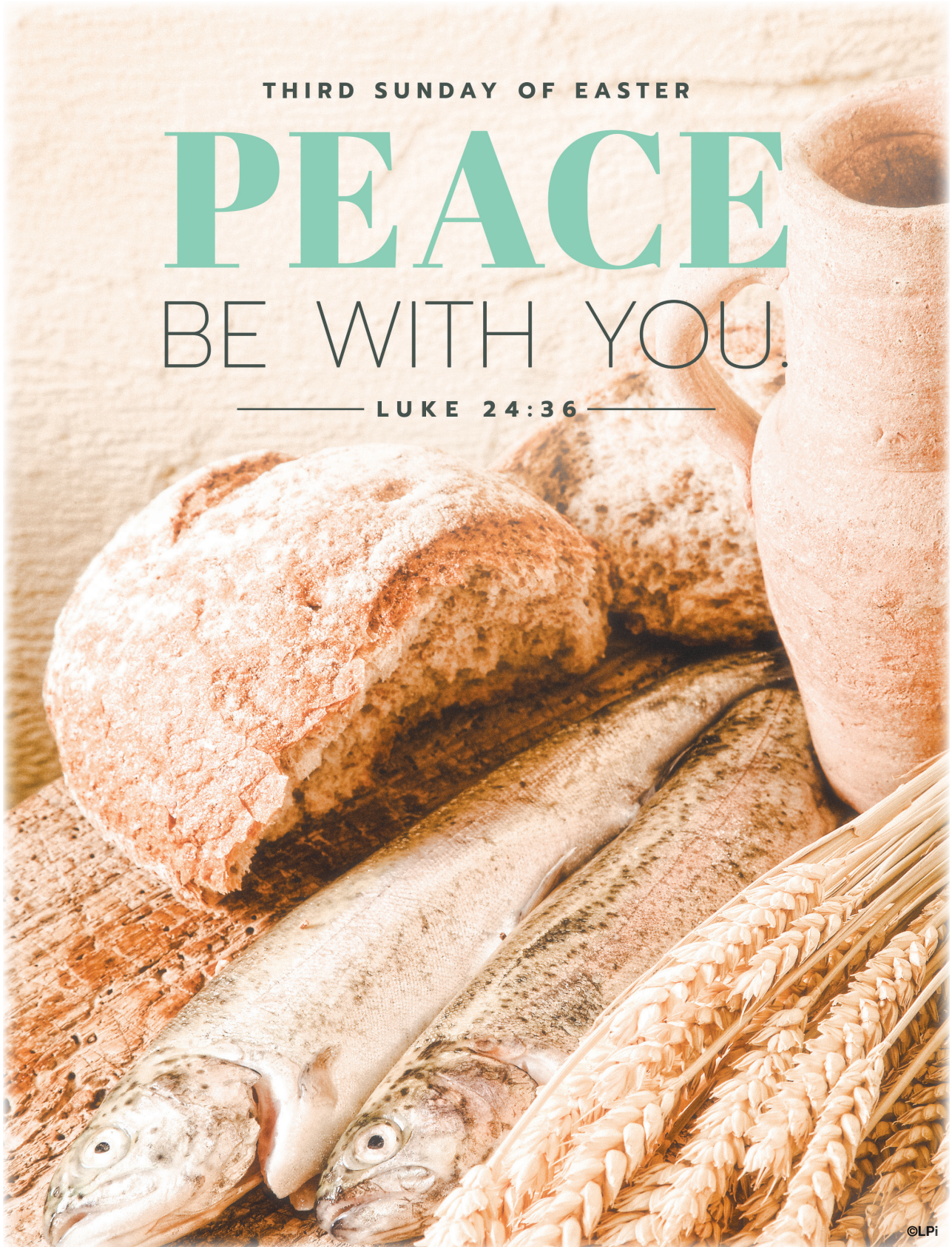

A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

We are all growing more and more aware of the **Partners In the Gospel** initiative that our Archdiocese has begun. Last week we learned from Archbishop Etienne the changes in the assignments of many of the priests of the archdiocese.



To refresh what is important for us: I will continue to serve as pastor here and will be joined (starting August 14) by Fr. Mike Bayard, SJ as parochial vicar. Fr. Matthew will begin full time work for the Jesuits in vocation promotion. He will continue to live locally and we can expect to see him from time to time as his duties allow.

Fr. Mike and I will serve both St. Joseph and St. Therese parishes as all of us together, parishioners one and all, will be working on a holy endeavor: to become one parish family.

The "Partners" initiative is not merely an "administrative re-organization" as can happen with corporations and other associations and businesses. In the words of the Archdiocese, we are working together for the following purpose:

"We want parish life to better respond to the current needs of the Church and bring more people to know Jesus Christ. We want full Masses, people celebrating the sacraments, more social outreach, an increase in youth participation – and much more! We want to better help people deepen their relationship with Christ."

As 'Partners' Sts. Therese and Joseph parishes are joining for the sake of Christ and for and in the love of God. Fundamentally, we are all renewing our commitment to live our baptism.

Challenging times? Yes! Exciting? Yes! A holy moment for us all? I think it is!

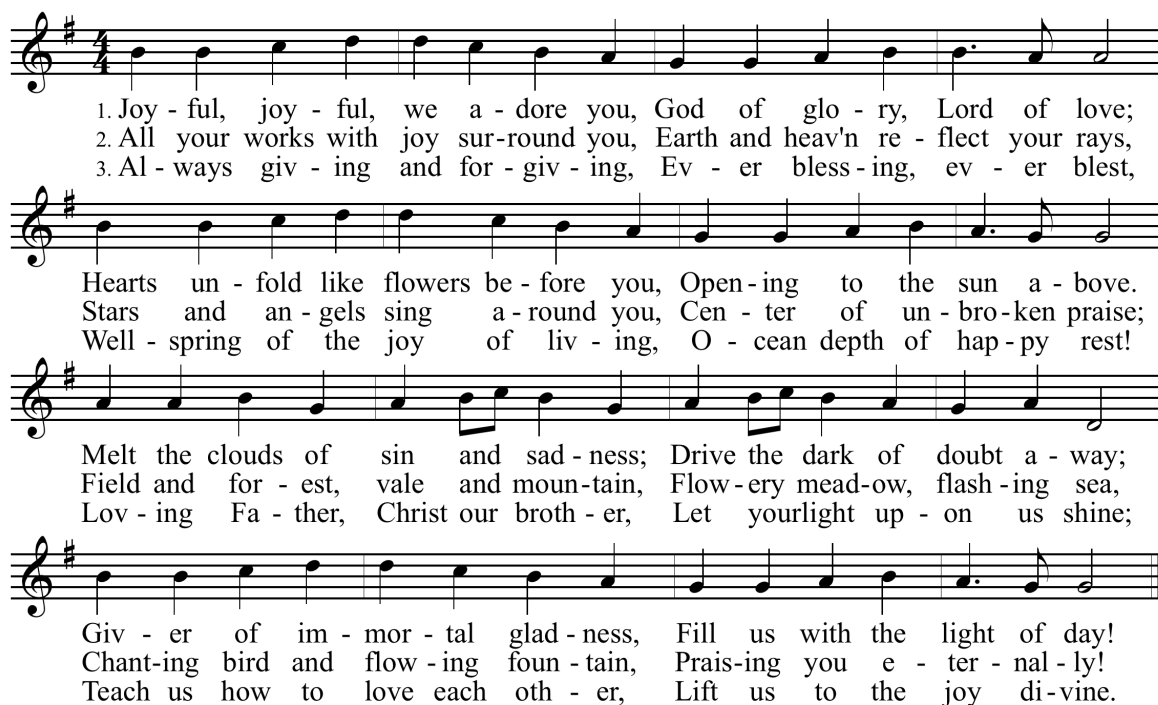

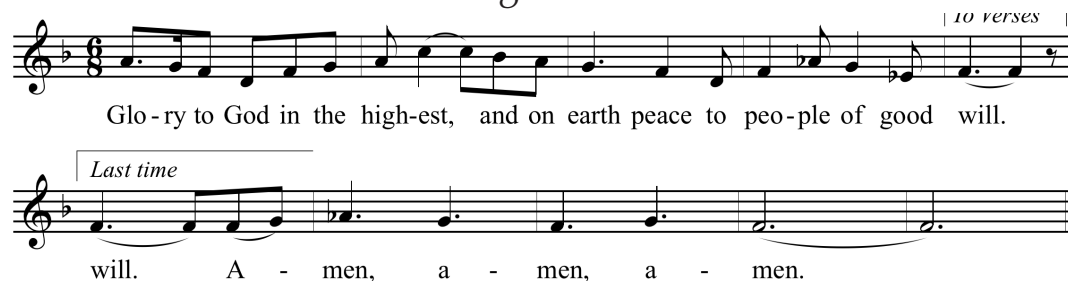

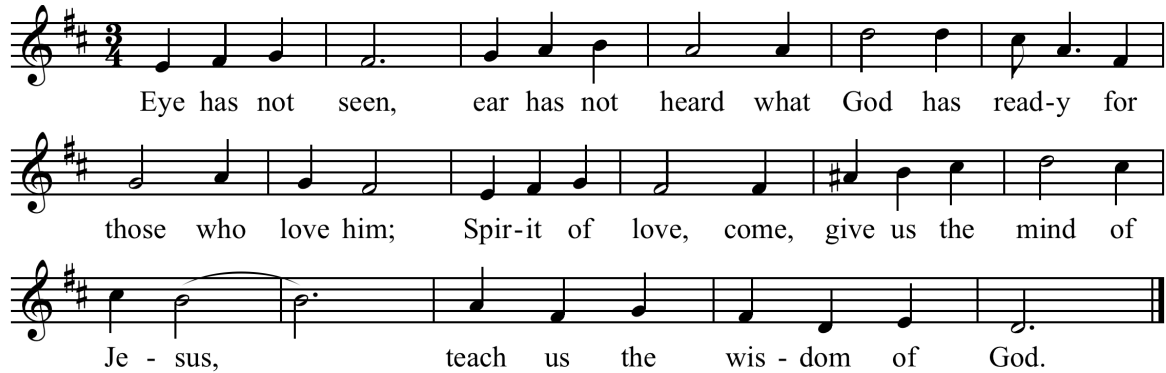
ALL ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD

HOUSING NEEDED: At the same time, the Asylum Accompaniment Team is looking for housing for another Nicaraguan asylum seeker, 25-year-old Jonster Celestino. From the same town as Alvaro, he arrived in the US over a year ago and is currently waiting on his asylum claim to be heard, a process that usually takes years.

He has been living with friends of parishioners Cathy and Matt for over a year, and has a full-time job on First Hill. He is taking upper-level ESL courses to prepare for a Certified Nursing Assistant Program.

Jonster is now looking for a more permanent, independent living arrangement, starting this summer. He can pay rent, and is happy with a small apartment or a room in someone's house.
