A Note from Fr. Chris

"The Mystery In the Music!"

Dear Friends,

Every Sunday we sing and the music we make is both for us and for God. We praise God in our songs; we remember God and many aspects of God's love shown us throughout our lives.

How does this music come about? What music is chosen?

You might like to know that our Music Director, Laura Ash spends time every week preparing our music. She reads the scripture lessons for each Sunday, looking for themes and topics in the scripture lessons. She then gives thought to the various musical settings she knows, asking herself: 'what songs mirror and reflect the lessons?' what is the mood and message of the song? 'how can it support the liturgical season and the prayer of the congregation.'

To do all this mean Laura digs deeply into her own faith life and her role as a leader of prayer. During the week she takes time to rehearse both herself and the choirs. Often enough, the week can also include her leading the music at a funeral or wedding. She works with our school and our Liturgy Committee and with our clergy so that our prayer in worship is well centered on the grace of God.

You see, the '*mystery in the music*' is how God speaks/sings to us and puts thoughts and messages into our ears and hearts. Laura and I have noticed from time to time how on any given Sunday the music chosen seems to be just right for the homily and scripture and way God is sending the Holy Spirit more deeply into our lives.

Much goes into the music at our Masses. I'd like to give a "SHOUT OUT" to Laura and to all our music ministers; **thank you** for your skill and generosity on our behalf.

It is said that St. Augustine wrote: "To sing is to pray twice." I'd like to encourage all of us to pray – TWICE! Sing at Mass. Join your voice with all of us in music that shows God our love, our gratitude, our praise and honor. It is an easy gift to give to God and a simple way to join together with others in doing good.

HOUSING NEEDED: At the same time, the Asylum Accompaniment Team is looking for housing for another Nicaraguan asylum seeker, 25-year-old Jonster Celestino. From the same town as Alvaro, he arrived in the US over a year ago and is currently waiting on his asylum claim to be heard, a process that usually takes years.

He has been living with friends of parishioners Cathy and Matt for over a year, and has a full-time job on First Hill. He is taking upper-level ESL courses to prepare for a Certified Nursing Assistant Program.

Jonster is now looking for a more permanent, independent living arrangement, starting this summer. He can pay rent, and is happy with a small apartment or a room in someone's house.
