This weekend as we celebrate the Great Feast of Pentecost, we will proclaim the first reading in a different language with the English translation in our Worship Aid. It's a reminder of the many languages and cultures present in our parish and how we are all enriched by the diversity and unity of our church. Let us hear one another, see one another and be in communion with one another.

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

Galatians 5:16-25

Brothers and sisters, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: immorality, impurity, lust, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions, occasions of envy, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit.

St Joe's School and Parish Rally for Earth Day



Over Earth Day weekend (April 19-22), both St. Joseph's School and members of the Parish participated in an important environmental event celebrating Earth Day. (Earth Day goes back to 1970!)

On Friday, April 19, St. Joseph's School partnered with Rotary Clubs around Puget Sound to engage in a major effort to collect and recycle lithium and alkaline batteries. This was part of a global effort and it was estimated that over 1 billion people in 192 countries participated in Earth Day events.

Why recycle? In particular, lithium batteries come in cell phones, laptops, tablets, power drills, e-bikes, electric vehicles, and anything rechargeable. Lithium-ion batteries are a phenomenal technology that can propel us into a clean energy and transportation future. They can also cause fires if not recycled properly. Only 17 percent of e-waste and less than 5 percent of lithium-ion battery-containing devices get recycled. Most end up in the garbage.

The St. Joe's School Green Team, a newly organized environmental group, helped plan and organize collection efforts for Friday, April 19, from 8 am to 12 noon. The Green Team was led by 7th Graders Lucia M and Ruthie N. A total of 16 students helped out that morning. They had tremendous energy. Their Supervisor is Jennifer Moyer-Taylor, a counselor at St. Joe's School.

Finally, on Sunday, April 21, there was a collection of lithium and alkaline batteries following the 9am and 11m masses down in the Social Hall. Once again there was a good collection of batteries. Members of the St. Joe's Climate Justice Committee volunteered including Kathy Wilmering and Mikka Nyarko, Co-Chairs, and Nori Hawkins.

All batteries were forwarded to Redwood Materials, the first U.S.-based battery recycling plant to host collection drives, yielding hundreds of thousands of pounds of cell phones, laptops, power drills, and other rechargeable electronics.

Liturgical Movement at Mass Next Weekend

SPECIAL OFFERING: LITURGICAL MOVEMENT AT 11:00am MASS

On Trinity Sunday (May 26th) just at the 11:00am Mass, I have invited Betsey Beckman, Laura Ash, and friends to embody my homily using Liturgical Movement to the hymn How Wonderful the Three-in-One.

The very mystical Cappadocian Fathers of fourth-century eastern Turkey (Gregory of Nyssa, Gregory Nazianzen, and Basil of Caesarea) developed some highly sophisticated thinking on the Trinity. It took three centuries of reflection on the Gospels to have the courage to say it, but they circled around to the best metaphor they could find, and the Greek word they daringly came up with was PERICHORESIS, or circle dance.

They wrote: "Whatever is going on in God is a flow, a radical relatedness, a perfect communion between Three – a circle dance of love. And God is not just a dancer. God is the dance itself."
