It is important to know, as well, that when we get to July, our priests will also be presiding at Mass at St. Therese. More about that next week!

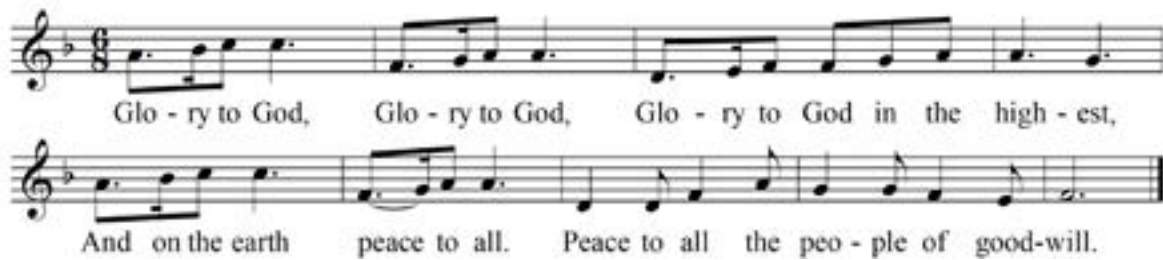

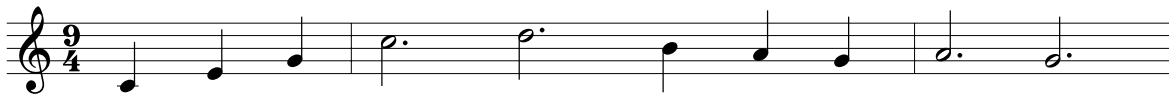

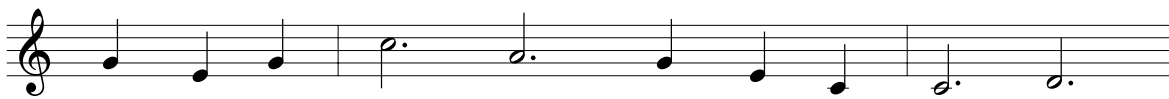

As a dammed river system and climate impacts threaten the extinction of Chinook salmon, a cornerstone of their culture and ancestral diet, they continue to do their part to uphold this relationship—but will it be enough to save wild salmon from extinction?

After the documentary, **WILL RUTT**, executive director of the Intercommunity Peace and Justice Center, will lead a discussion of the film, and offer ways to take action in solidarity with salmon and the Nez Perce Tribe.
