A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

In the gospel this weekend is a line that troubles many of us. It reads: "Whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin." [Mark 3:29]

What does this mean? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains it this way: God's mercy cannot be limited, but anyone who deliberately refuses to accept God's mercy, who deliberately turns away from God's goodness and grace and salvation, can find themselves leaning towards rejection of God and eternal loss. (paragraph 1864, Catechism)

There are very few of us who would follow such an approach; few of us who are ever in danger of sinning against the Holy Spirit. But it might well be true that we often enough ignore the Holy Spirit.

At times we find ourselves thinking we could do better with our lives, with our choices, with how we live. We feel prompted to be more generous, more forgiving, less judgmental. We feel an urge to get out of our 'comfort zone' and be involved in civic or church activities that serve the common and greater good. We find ourselves thinking that we don't pay much attention to our spiritual lives, to our soul and a relationship with God that is meaningful.

It might well be the Holy Spirit who is trying to influence our thinking, our hearts. Do we really want to ignore such grace and gift from God? Even if it is not a sin, isn't it actually a bad choice to ignore the nudges and prompting of the Holy Spirit – especially when it would lead to a greater self, a better person both personally and for others?

It might be Jesus' strong message in Mark 3:29 means for us to take seriously our life, our purpose and our future.

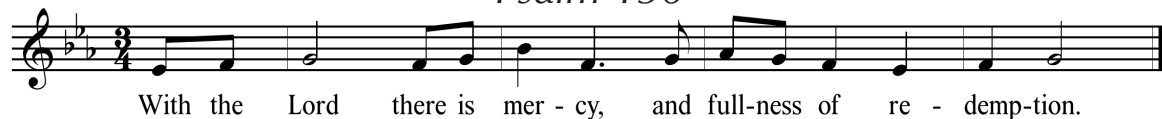

Brothers and sisters: Since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, *I believed, therefore I spoke*, we too believe and therefore we speak, knowing that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence. Everything indeed is for you, so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God. Therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal. For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.

Mark 3:20-35

Jesus came home with his disciples. Again the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat. When his relatives heard of this they set out to seize him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "By the prince of demons he drives out demons."

Summoning them, he began to speak to them in parables, "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand; that is the end of him. But no one can enter a strong man's house to plunder his property unless he first ties up the strong man. Then he can plunder the house. Amen, I say to you, all sins and all blasphemies that people utter will be forgiven them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin." For they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." His mother and his brothers arrived. 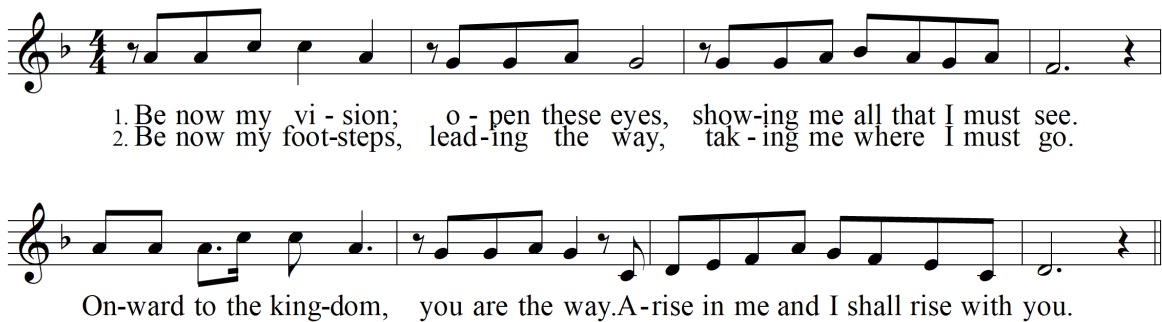

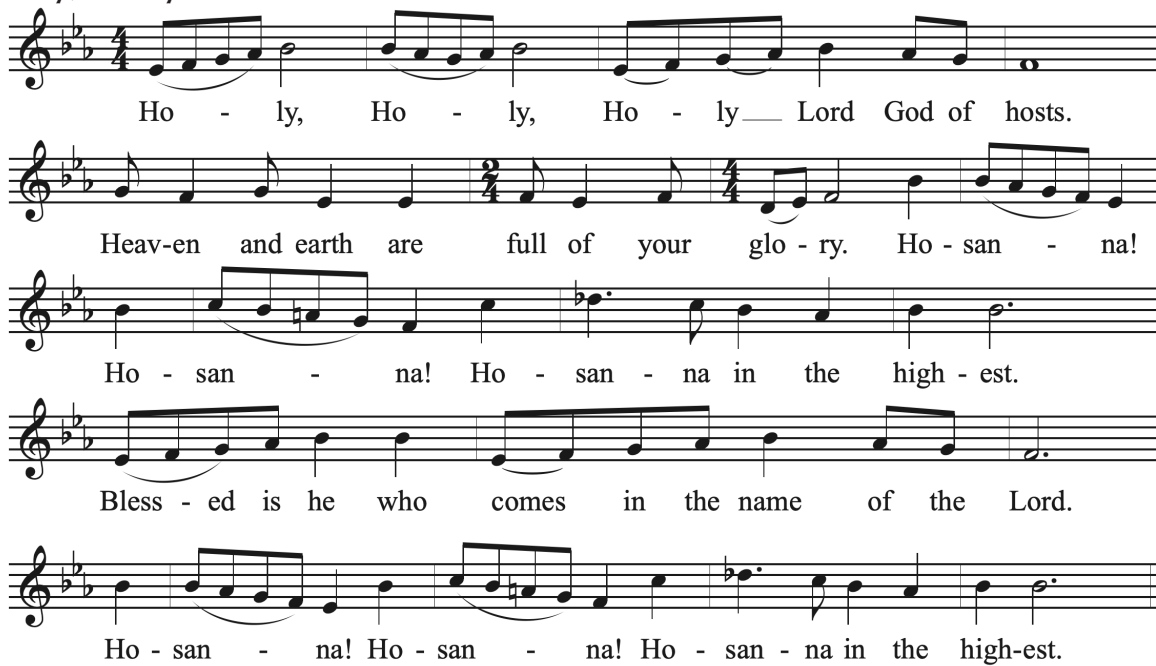

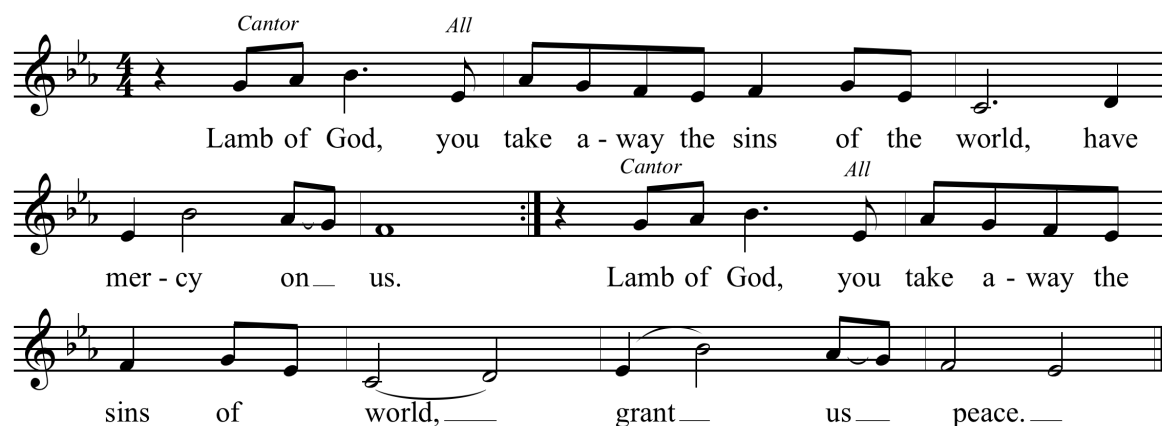
