A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

This annual celebration brings to mind my own father – Dad.

I grew up at a time when TV shows tended to feature men who were tough. TV Westerns were quite popular with ‘gunslinging’ heroes. It was the 1950’s and the experience of the 2nd World War was fresh for many people. Movies and television kept alive visions of mostly men as fighters in the great effort to stop the warring nations. Dad was in the Navy, although he was never in direct harm or fighting. He loved to watch TV programs about the war, fiction or historical; I watched many of them myself at his side.

As a boy I idolized the tough guys on TV. As for Dad, however, what I idolized about him was, really, just the opposite. He was quite gentle and compassionate, kind and tender. He was up at 5:00 am and off to work in the Chrysler factory; thirty-six years long. He brought home his paycheck and gave it to Mom. I never knew him to spend any money on himself. He coached all seven of his children in baseball; went on many Boy Scout camping trips, was a warm and safe lap to crawl into the worst or best of days.

When I want a ‘picture’ of God as father I resort to my own Dad’s face and character. I have other ‘faces’ too that broaden and expand my notion of God.

On this day honoring fathers, it all comes together for me in Dad’s smile and my memories. I hope you have similar thoughts and notions for your own imagining God. Isn’t it good that we have both Mother’s Day and Father’s Day? God outdoes all our thoughts and pictures and yet, God can also be as close as a dad’s embrace.
