What is the Santa Marta Center



What do we do

The Santa Marta Center is Comprehensive support and emergency program and shelter for queer youth in El Salvador facing homelessness, forced displacement and violence

How do we do it?

The Center seeks to emulate a "Home First" approach that opposes the traditional shelters, we instead, advocate to provide an extended time residency, seeking in this way to reduce the impact of trauma and fear on decision-making and allow them to set priorities from a stable and long lasting situation.

Our residents and cases

Over the last two years we have supported over 200 queer youth in Central America facing homelessness providing shelter, psychological care amongst other services

Our Budget

We are able to provide all of our services to 12 - 16 people per month with under \$3,000.00 per month

Our future

If we can have 150 people subscribing to our monthly donation system for \$20 we can reach our goal
