A Note from Fr. Chris

Today marks an important day in the history of the Seattle Archdiocese. Nearly all parishes are celebrating this weekend in a new family configuration and this is true for us **as we become Partners in the Gospel with St. Therese parish.**

The task before us is to **become one parish family**. Together we will come to define what our family is like, how as one family we respond to the mission of the Church and the care of the people in our locale. *It is important to say that this is not a job for the clergy of our parish but of all the people.* All voices and hearts are needed to be church in this place and together shoulder the burden of forming and sustaining one community.

Today it is enough to recognize this moment as a call from God. It may seem like a monumental task is before us and it is true that this is not going to be easy. The words from today's letter from St. Paul might help: *"Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong."* [2 Cor 12:10]

For the sake of Christ we hope to truly become a holy community. *For the sake of Christ* each one of us is at Eucharist each week. *For the sake of Christ* we try to fulfill his teachings and plan for salvation. *For the sake of Christ* this movement into one parish family will change us and *for the sake of Christ* change others – that all may be saved, Christ's supreme work to redeem the world.

I am looking forward to this call from Christ. We are asked to enlarge not merely our pews but our hearts and love for one another, and for the abandoned, the person in need or distress, the young and old among us; and those who have not yet heard the Good News.

Forth we go – together!

A New Jesuit Joins Our Parishes



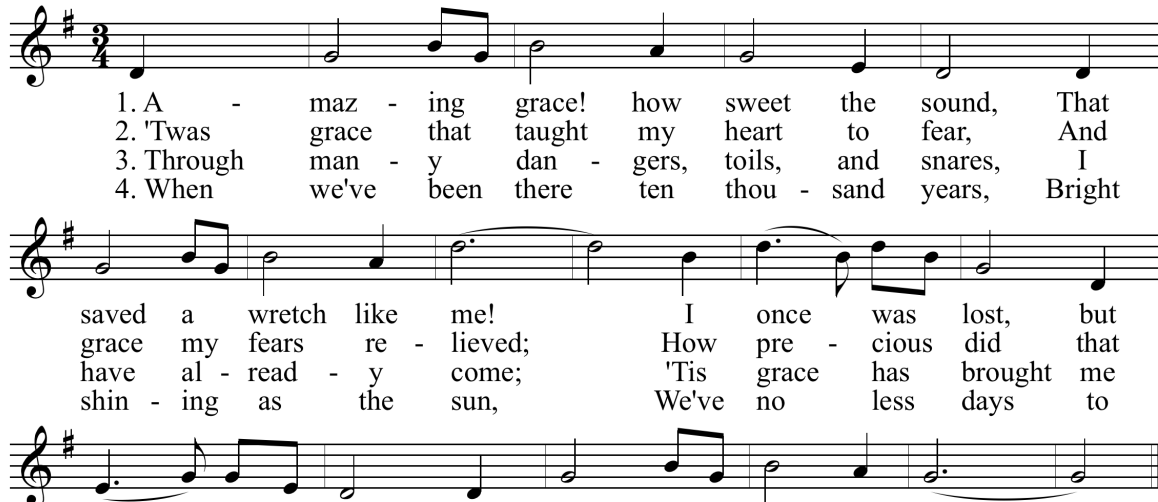
