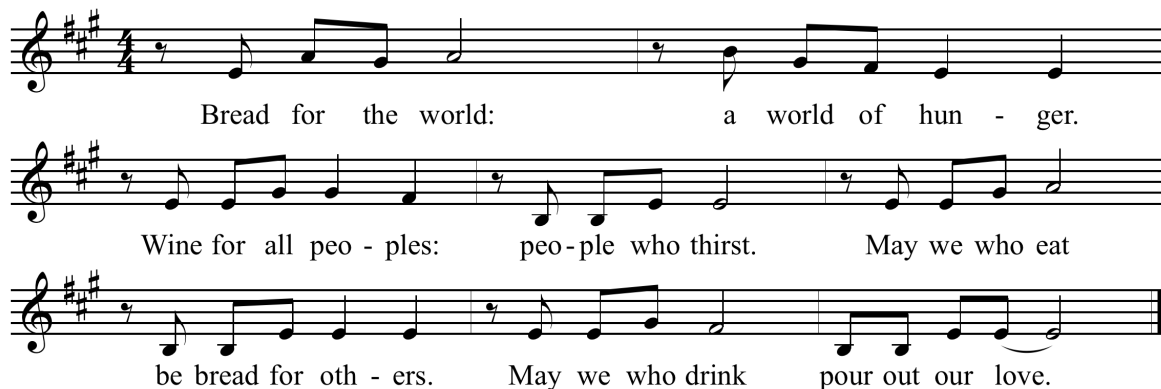

Join us on Sunday morning, July 28th after both the 9am and 11am Mass for some extended hospitality to say goodbye to our beloved Fr. Matthew.

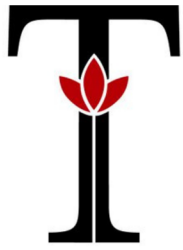
