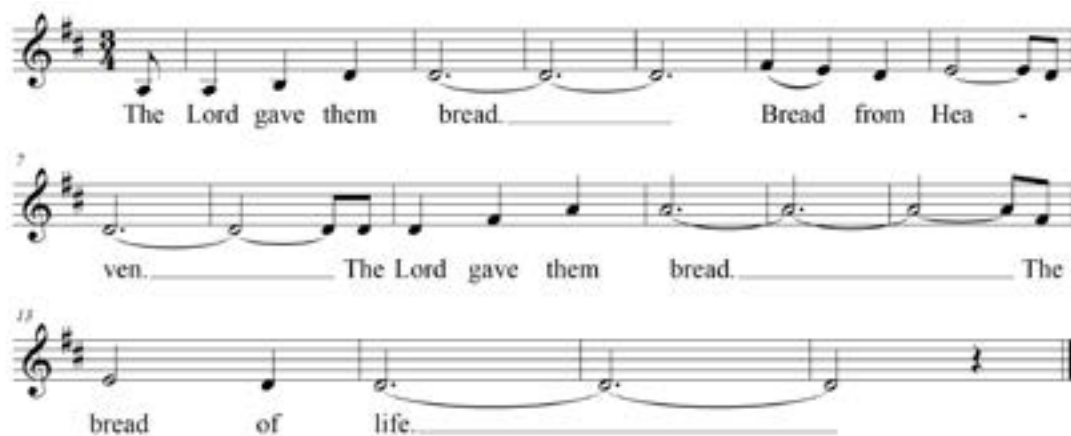

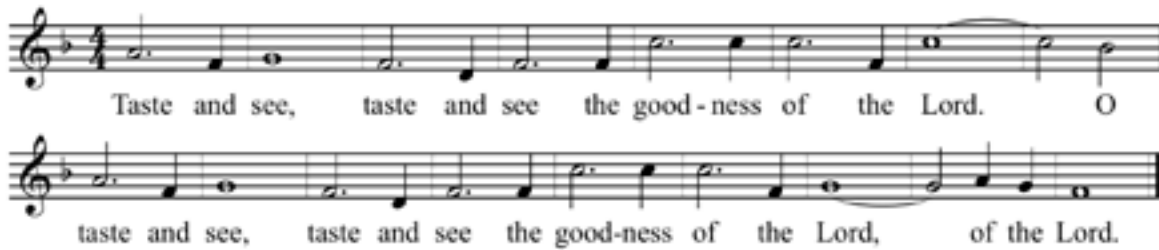
ALL ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD

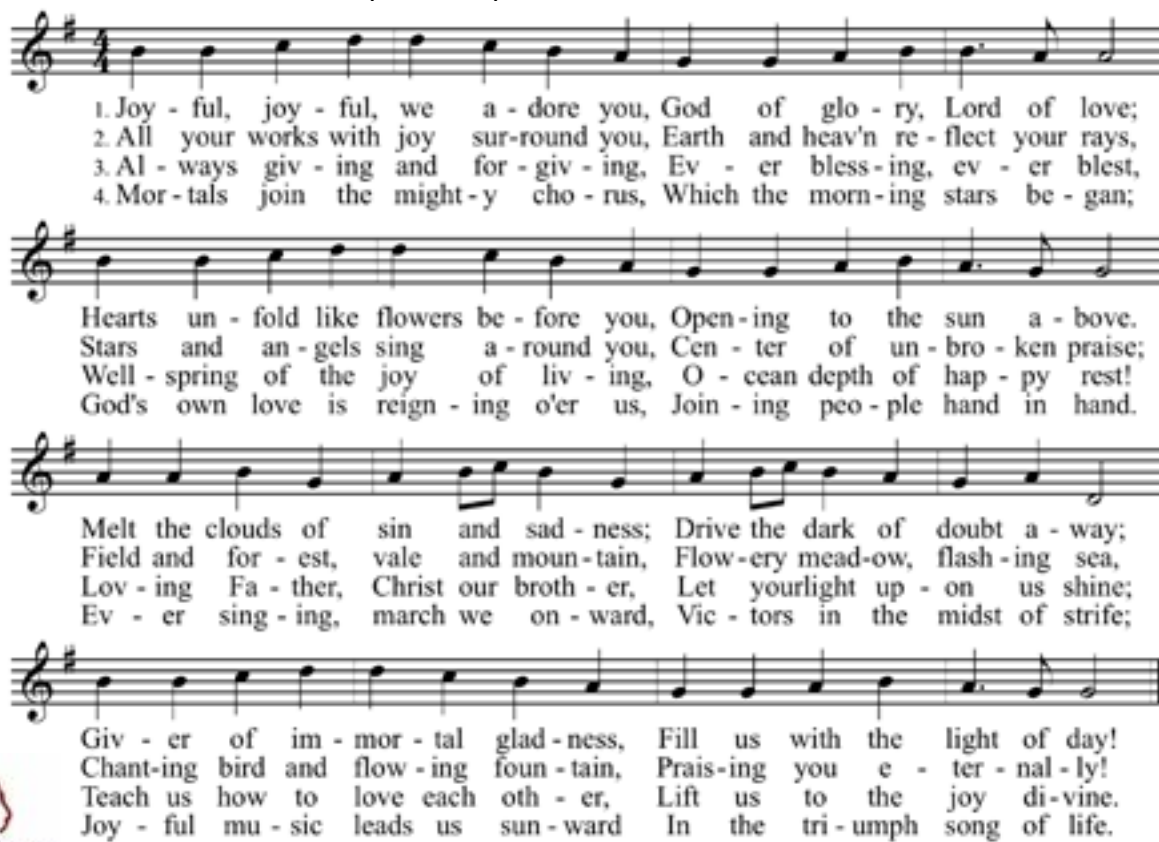
