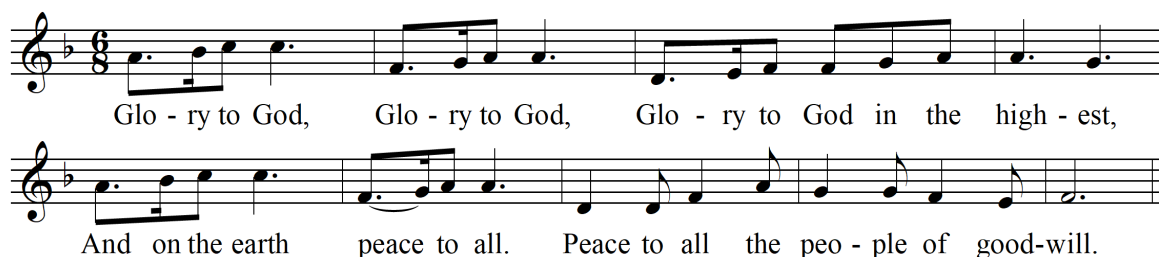

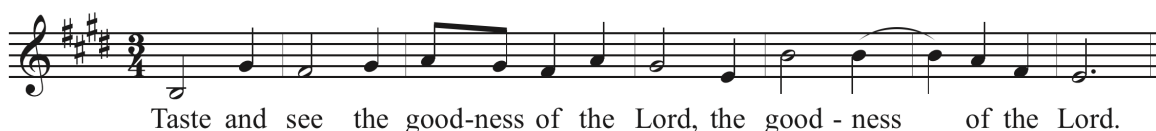

in blessing we'll uncover, in sharing we'll discover your substance and your sign. *Ref.*

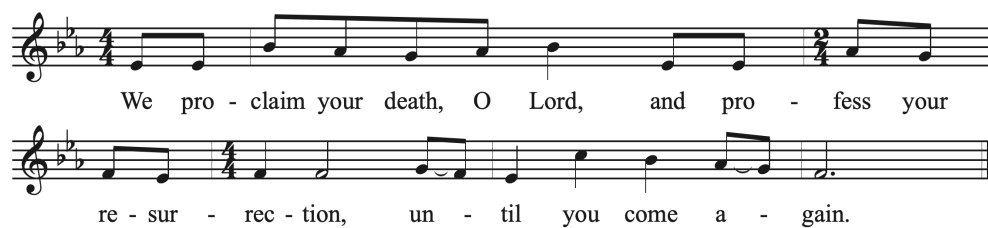

We will be having refresher training on Sunday, September 8th after the 9:00 am mass.

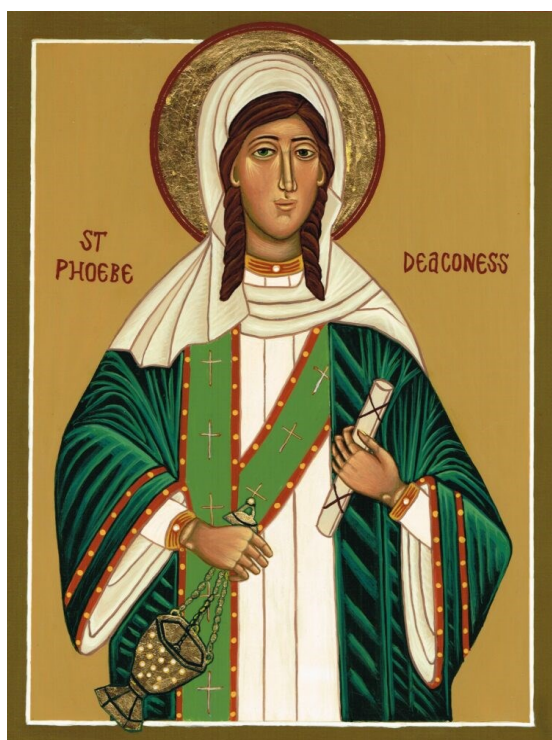

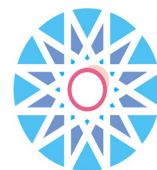

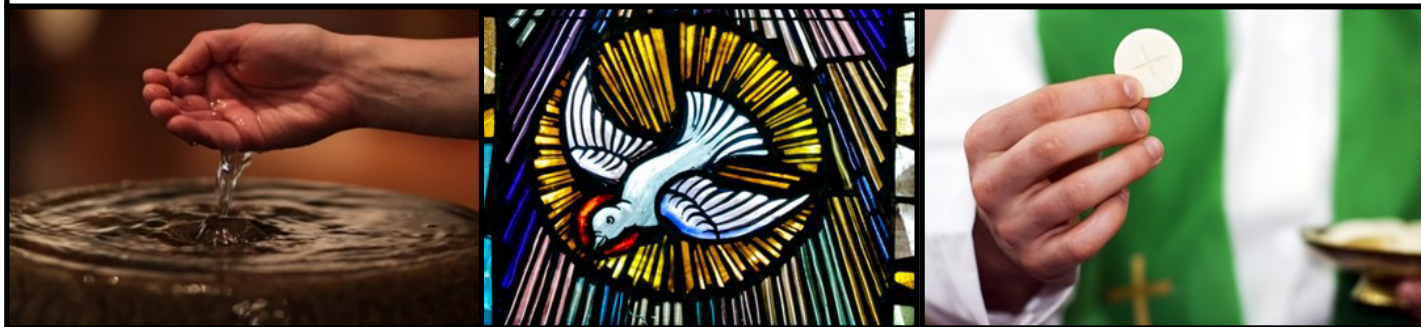

- ♦ Are you experiencing God's call in your life and seeking Baptism, Full Communion or Confirmation in the Catholic Church?
- ♦ If you are, please consider participating in the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. OCIA / RCIA is an opportunity to explore your faith questions with others and learn what the Catholic Church teaches. It is a process of discernment and gradual conversion to become a full member of the Catholic Church through the sacraments.
- ♦ We begin with your faith journey, your questions about the faith, and if you discover that you want baptism, communion and confirmation, you will continue on in your journey toward becoming Catholic, but no commitment is required for the first few months of the journey.
