September 15 The People of St. Joseph

Dear Friends,

This week in the scripture lessons for daily Mass we have been reading Luke's gospel, Chapter 6. We have seen again how Jesus chose his twelve apostles and then taught the lessons which we call "The Sermon On the Mount."

I like what *Clarence Jordan*, a farmer and New Testament Greek scholar had to say about this passage. He wrote that Jesus started a 'movement.' He chose twelve leaders as his close companions and co-workers and set out to begin something new. His words in the "Sermon On the Mount," writes Jordan, are not about inspiration but about perspiration. Jesus' words are meant to set people in motion!

Clarence Jordan's take on Jesus' preaching made me think how Jesus didn't start a study group, he didn't gather the apostles into a scripture reflection club, he isn't known for forming committees or task forces or councils. Looking at the full scope of Jesus' teaching it seems pretty clear he is all about doing, working, caring, healing, forgiving, feeding, gathering, and of course praying. Jesus is all about 'movement.'

For St. Therese and St. Joseph parishes this idea of movement captures what we are experiencing. Things are changing, WE are changing. What was is being reshaped. What we thought we were is being remodeled. We are reforming, restructuring, reformatting, remaking. What we must not be is *resisting*!

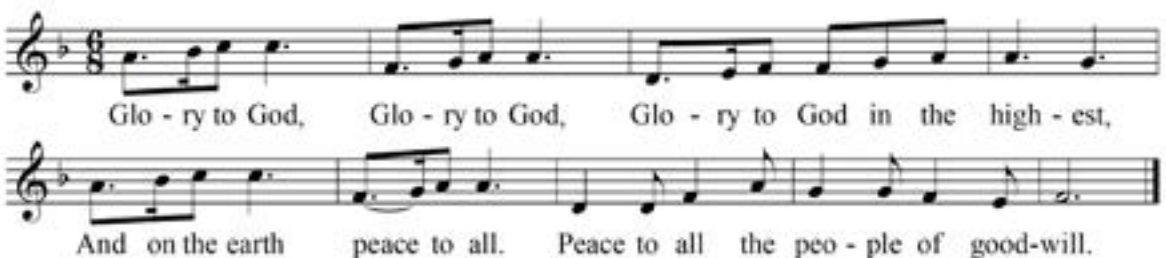

They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him.

He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

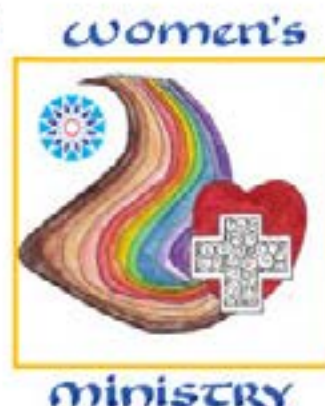

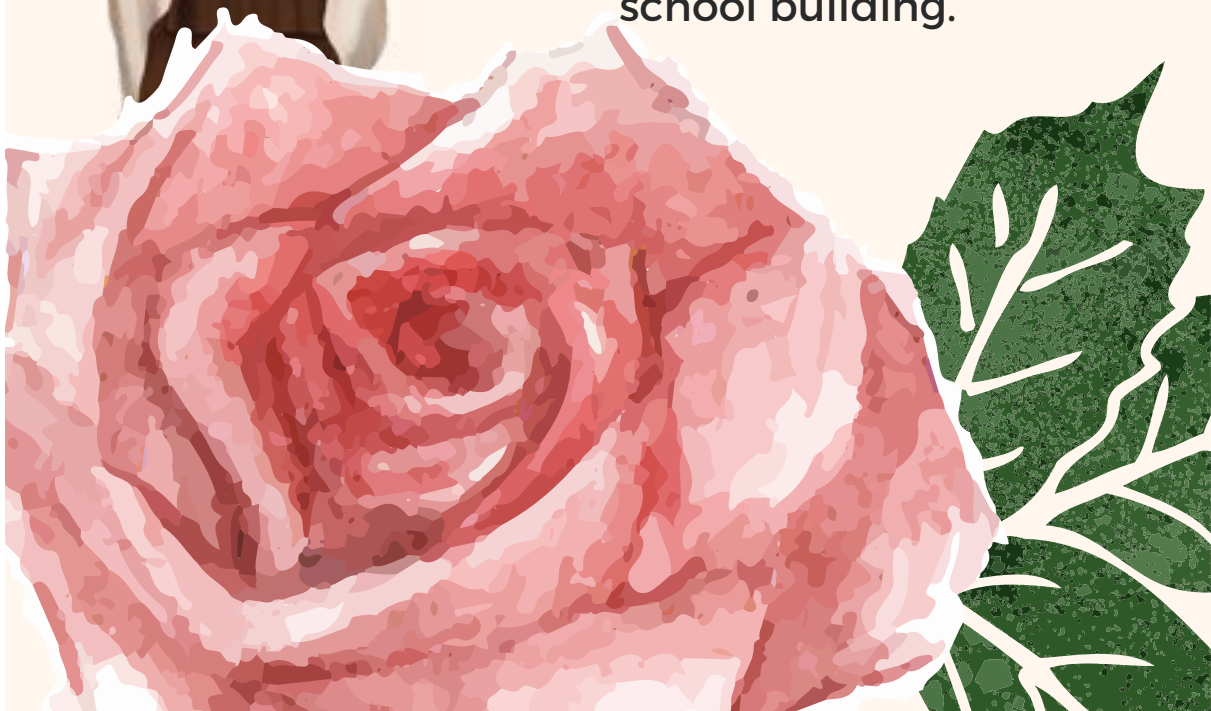

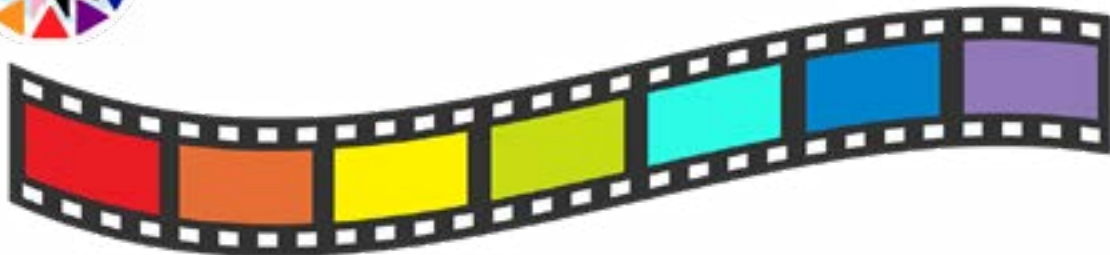
