Volunteer with the Asylum Seeker Accompaniment Team!

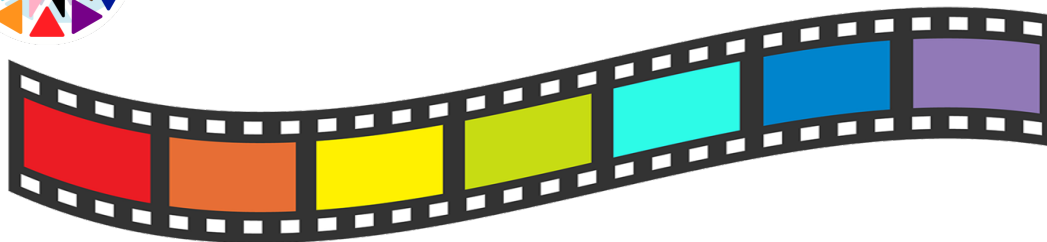

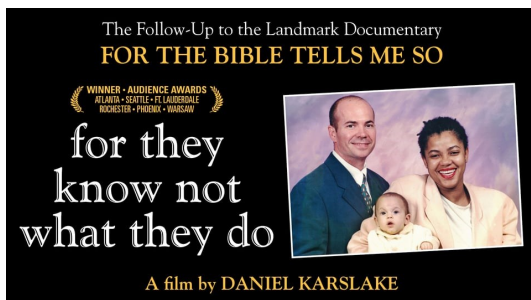
