October 1st Therese of Lisieux OCD 1873 – 1897

A French Discalced Carmelite who is widely venerated in modern times. She is popularly known in English as the Little Flower of Jesus, or simply the Little Flower.

"Love proves itself by deeds, so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden me. The only way I can prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love."

October 2nd The Guardian Angels

A feast in honor of the guardian angels was first observed in the 16th century. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar.

Psalm 91:11 "He commands His angels concerning you, to guard you in all your ways."

October 3rd St. Francis Borgia, S.J. 1510-1572

A Jesuit priest, he established a book of rules for the Jesuit Order that ensured spiritual and intellectual formation and an apostolic character. He is often regarded as the second founder of the Jesuit Order (St. Ignatius Loyola being the first!).

"Sometimes the Lord reveals his will for us in stages. Many people hear a call in later life to serve in a different capacity. We never know what the Lord has in store for us."

October 4th St. Francis of Assisi 1181-1226

An Italian mystic, poet, and Catholic friar who founded the religious order the Franciscans. Inspired to lead a Christian life of poverty, he became a beggar and itinerant preacher.

He said to them in reply, “What did Moses command you?” They replied, “Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her.” But Jesus told them, “Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate.” In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, “Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.”

And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, “Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it.” Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

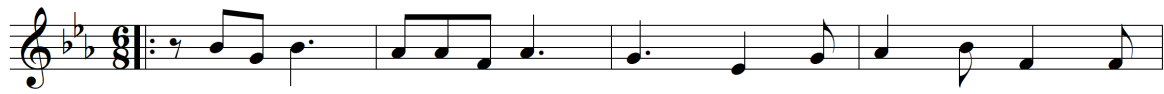

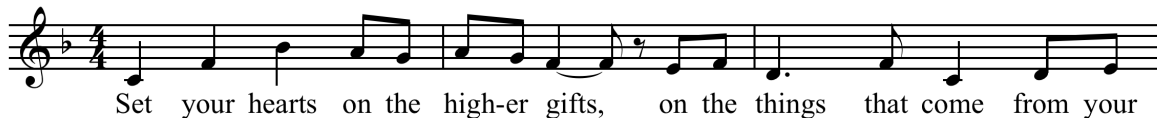

Parish Family Advisory Council

What is a Parish Family Advisory Council?

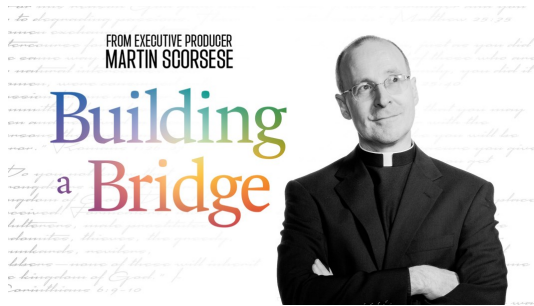
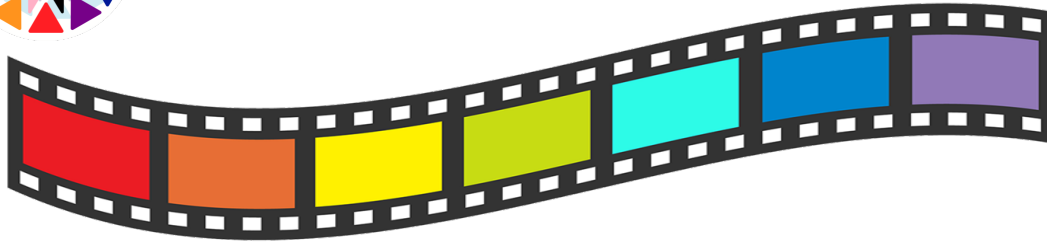
