A Note from Fr. Chris

Dear Friends,

Numerous parishioners who regularly attend the **St. Joseph 5:30pm Sunday Mass** have inquired about it. They have talked about how they loved when the Mass was observed as a sort-of “contemplative Mass” and expressed a hope that we would bring it back.

Coming out of the pandemic and coupled with a change in both Music Director and Pastor, no decision was made to discontinue the ‘contemplative’ style. It simply was not part of the experience of either of us. Both Laura Ash (Music Director) and I come from a background greatly influenced by the 2nd Vatican Council which decreed that our liturgical life should be expressed by “full, conscious, active participation.” So we have carried on all our Masses with the lights fully lit and the music alive, encouraging a sense of participation among all the congregants.

At the same time, we do recognize the desire for an opportunity to pray in a quieter, gentler spirit. To that end we have determined that it would be good for us to offer a monthly **‘Contemplative Mass.’**

First Sundays each month we will set up the church at 5pm with low lighting, candles lit, altar and church prepared, incense burning, quiet music. We welcome all who would enjoy some quiet time with God and their own thoughts to come during that half-hour before Mass begins at 5:30pm. Mass will begin without a procession and music choices will tend towards a more simple style.

Why only once a month? Keep in mind that we are in a time of transition. We are just beginning to become a new community together. We need to take our time going forward; much is likely to change. For the staff and community, we want to enter into this period with openness to many possibilities as to what it means to become a new parish, a new people for God.

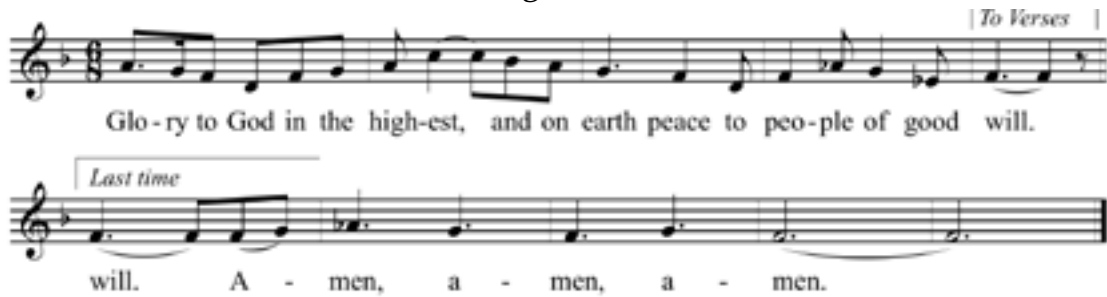

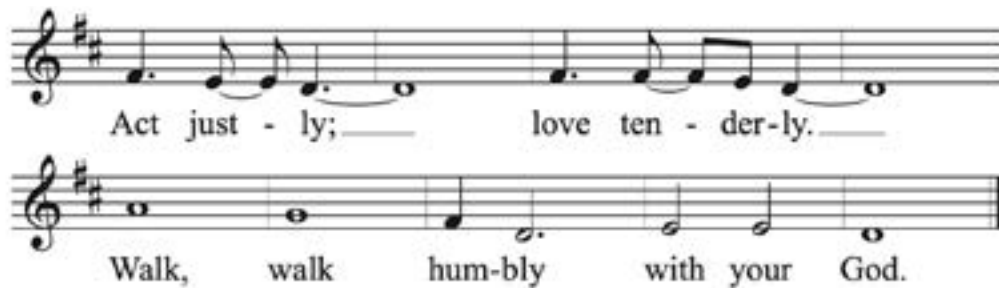

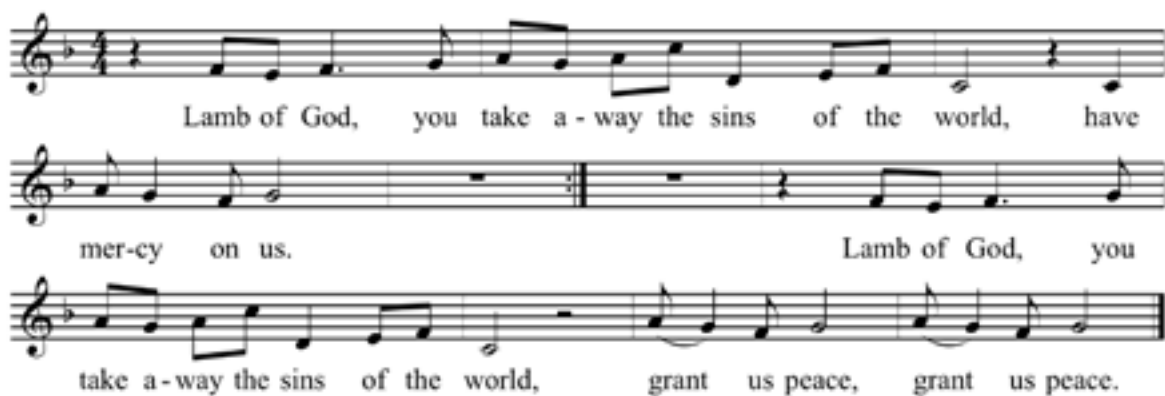

What is a Parish Family Advisory Council?

A PFAC is a consultative body made up of representatives from each parish in the family. This group will be an important resource for Fr. 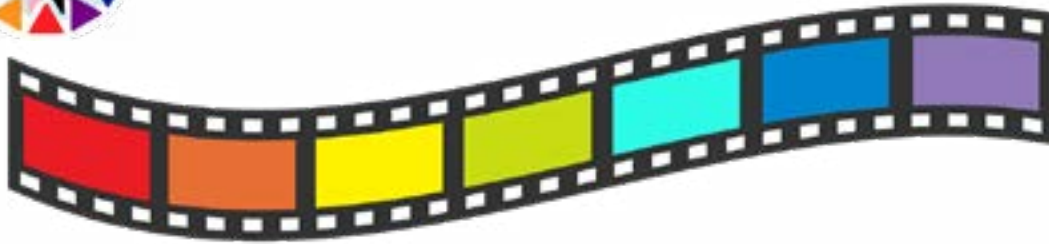
