THANK YOU TO ALL WHO ADDED YOUR GOOD ENERGY TO THE CLIMATE CHANGE SUMMIT!

The first all-parish intergenerational Climate Change Summit sponsored by the Climate Justice Committee met on Sunday, September 29 in the St. Joseph Parish Center.

The hope for the Summit was to provide a meeting ground for parishioners to identify issues close their hearts, determine specific goals and connect to take practical actions to meet the challenges of climate change.

More than 40 people gathered to hear Keynote speaker, Anna Johnson give perspective and insights into the Church's environmental work as the Laudato Si' North American Program Director. Then they divided into working groups to focus on areas of their choosing to discuss obstacles, opportunities, and committed themselves to specific actions to take to make a difference.

Focus areas:

- **Personal/household carbon footprint reduction**
- **Advocacy for environmental issues**
- **Working within the organization of the Church**
- **Support for our sister parishes in El Salvador**
- **Investments in truly green businesses**

All participants have received reports from their working groups, and the parish can expect to get more specific information about their projects as they progress.

Climate Justice is on the Ballot

Before you vote this fall, please take the time to learn about how Initiative I-2117 would affect climate justice in Washington State.

Washington's Climate Commitment Act (CCA) aims for net zero carbon emissions by 2050. It provides companies that emit carbon an incentive to adopt more responsible operations. Money generated by the CCA is used for multiple climate friendly services such as a system to track and address air pollution in underserved areas; support for communities affected by climate change induced sea level rise or by fires; and much more. Initiative I-2117 would repeal the CCA. It would reverse our state's commitment to progress toward a better future.
