Between 2011-2014 hundreds of millions of dollars were spent to restore the Elwha river and the surrounding forest. Removal of 3 dams on this river in the Olympic Peninsula has enabled the wonderful return of salmon into the Elwha watershed. This December, the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) plans to sell 4 parcels of timber within the watershed. Allowing all that restoration work to be undone by logging makes no sense! St. Joseph Climate Justice Committee urges you to voice dissent about this plan. Ask the Lands Commissioner, Hilary Franz, to stop the planned sales.
