When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, *Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord*, and to offer the sacrifice of *a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons*, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

“Now, Master, you may let your servant go
in peace, according to your word,
for my eyes have seen your salvation,
which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples:
a light for revelation to the Gentiles,
and glory for your people Israel.”

The child’s father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, “Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted-and you yourself a sword will pierce-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.”

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

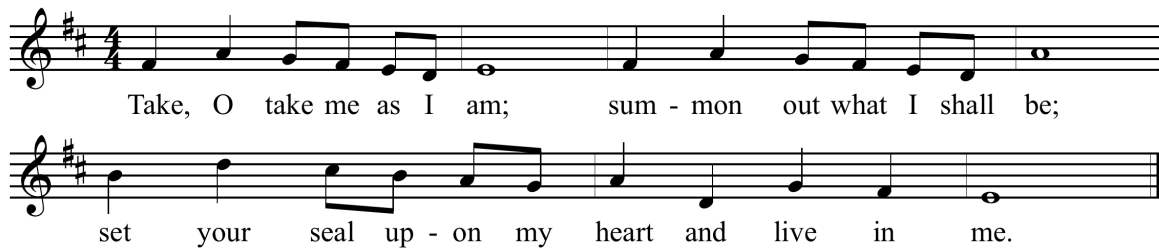

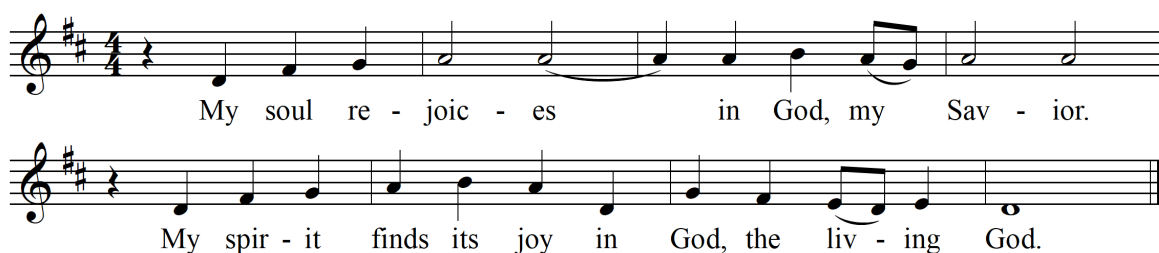

Seattle Prep Students Doing Justice: A Presentation on IFTJ 2024

In October, over 1,800 High School and College Students from Jesuit Preps and Universities, including students from Seattle Prep, attended the Ignatian Family Teach-In for Justice in Washington, D.C.

Over the weekend, they networked with students from all over the US, participated in workshops and plenary sessions on Justice Issues, learned about advocacy and community organizing, stood in solidarity as advocates in front of the US Capitol, and met with their legislators to share their concerns (Prep students met with staffers from Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal, Congressman Adam Smith and Senator Patty Murray.)

The Christian Future and the Fate of Earth

Fr. Thomas Berry (1914-2009) was a Catholic priest with deep understanding of world religions and cultural history. By 1970 he recognized the emergent ecological devastation being brought about by our 20th century mode of human presence.

In May of 1996, Fr. Thomas spoke here at St. Joseph's, encouraging us to view the divine in the context of The Universe Story. Further, he summoned Christians to attend to the ecological crisis and indicated that the time of transition toward new awakening will be very difficult. He wrote:

"Only religious forces can move human consciousness at the depth needed. Only religious forces can sustain the effort that will be required over the long period during which adjustment must be made. Only religion can measure the magnitude of what we are about."

Earth's life system disruptions are all around us: drought, excessive heat and wild-fires such as in Los Angeles; hurricanes and floods such as in North Carolina. In view of challenges ahead, Fr. Thomas also wrote:

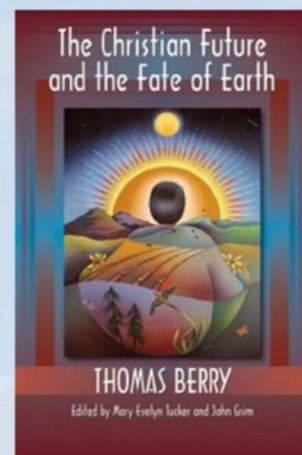
"That we will succeed is to some extent assured...by the forces that sent the galaxies into space, that shaped Earth and brought forth living creatures.... We cannot expect to achieve anything substantial without upheaval... The future is hopeful because of the integral cosmological story available to us for the first time."

We pray to be open to new ways of understanding our place in this amazing universe. None can solve our current problems, but each of us can do our bit. What will the effect on planet Earth be of your next decisions or actions?

Holy Spirit, guide each of us toward the changes in lifestyle we need to make.

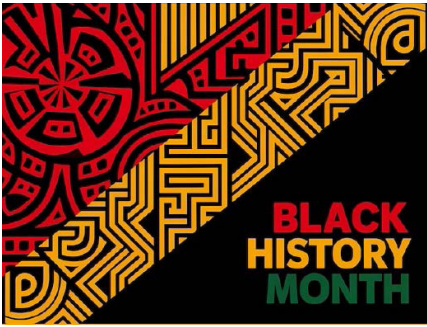

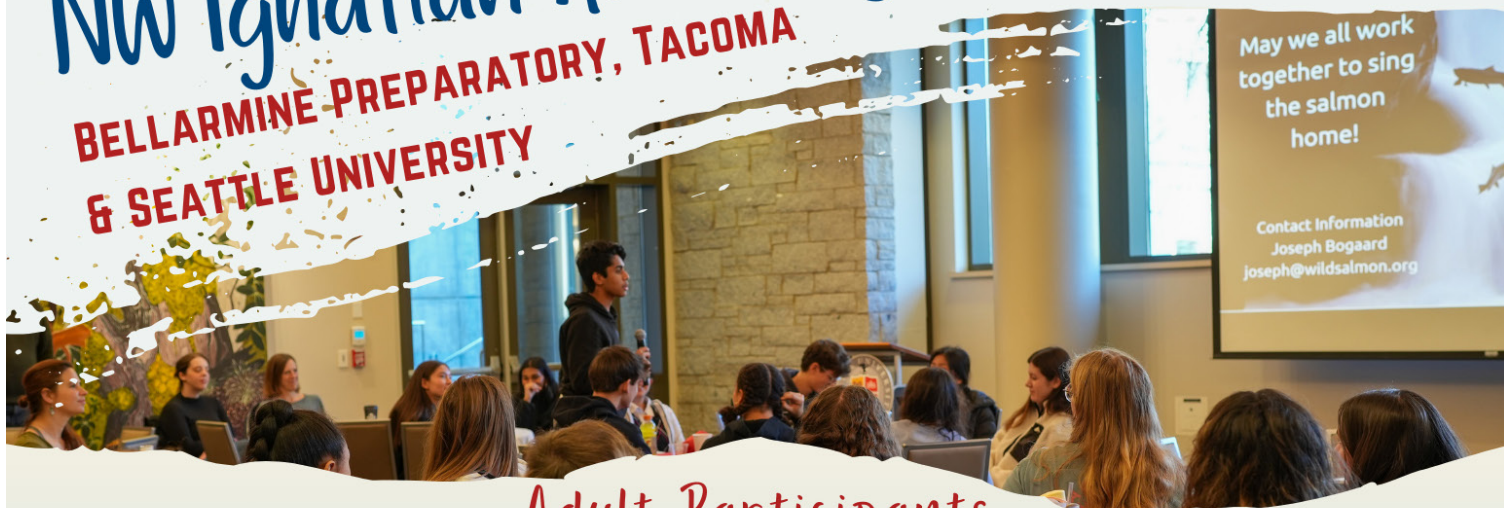
