Dear St. Joseph and St. Therese parish family members:

Peace to all of you, now that we have begun our Lenten journey.

As you know, back in November when Father Chris Cartwright, S.J., stepped down as pastor, Archbishop Paul Etienne appointed Deacon Steve Wodzanowski to serve as pastoral coordinator of your community. This was an interim assignment, designed to address an immediate need.

Last weekend, Deacon Steve was able to share good news: Archbishop Etienne has formally appointed him pastoral coordinator for a three-year term beginning on July 1, 2025. Today, I am writing to share with you my support for this decision.

Deacon Steve's appointment helps provide the continuity of leadership needed right now, and as Partners in the Gospel develops over the next several years.

Deacon Steve has a warm, collaborative relationship with Fathers Mike Bayard, S.J., and Phil Boroughs, S.J., who will continue as your parish priests, and with the staff and consultative groups serving your parish family. This arrangement helps ensure continued sacramental and pastoral care for the whole community.

I am grateful to Archbishop Etienne for making this appointment and to Deacon Steve for accepting this mission. Please know of my prayers and support as Partners continues to unfold and the USA West Province continues to serve the Archdiocese of Seattle through these times of change.

A MESSAGE FROM DEACON STEVE

Dear Friends,

As we take the next steps *Partners in the Gospel* together, I want to outline the next important part of our process.

The next step in the *Partners in the Gospel* plan is the creation of a **Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC)** which will in time become the Pastoral Council for our single parish.

The **PFAC** will be the key consultative body for implementing and guiding *Partners in the Gospel*. They will be concerned with changes, events, and collaborations that impact the ENTIRE parish family. This diverse group of 9-12 people representing our four communities, two schools, with a range of ages both male and female will meet with me to discern the eventual mission and structure of our single parish.

I am looking for thoughtful and prayerful Catholic individuals who are regular participants at Mass, practice stewardship, and are open to discerning how the Holy Spirit is calling us to form a unified parish community. Some key qualities I am looking for are people who listen well to others, are open minded about various ways of being church, and creative in exploring a new model of parish life.

This will be an open process.

Four Communities - One Family

WHY A PARISH FAMILY ADVISORY COUNCIL?

Partners in the Gospel focuses on re-envisioning and restructuring parish life for mission. This vision takes shape through the One Parish Plan, a strategic pastoral plan guiding parish families toward becoming one canonical parish—unified under a single Pastoral Coordinator. The Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC), a group of 9-12 parishioners from across the parish family, plays a vital role by advising Deacon Steve in developing this plan.



ROLE OF THE PARISH FAMILY ADVISORY COUNCIL

The PFAC serves as the Pastoral Coordinator's primary advisory group for Partners in the Gospel, focusing on the overall health of the parish family rather than individual communities. They guide the creation of the One Parish Plan, setting pastoral priorities and goals while ensuring broad consultation and discernment. However, implementation is the responsibility of the leadership team, staff, and volunteers.



CRITERIA OF PARISH FAMILY ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS

- Baptized Roman Catholic, and in good standing with the church
- Active participant in the life of the parish for at least 1 year
- Ability to make a 3-year commitment with ability to renew as needed
- Reflect the age, ethnic, cultural and economic makeup of the parish family
- Able to represent and work on behalf of the whole parish family - *and not be limited to representing their own community, particular interests or specific ministries.*
- Supportive of the Partners in the Gospel initiative

SELECTION OF PARISH FAMILY ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS

PFAC members will be identified through direct invitation from the Pastoral Coordinator and an open call to the parish family. Interested candidates will review the role, criteria, and tasks before applying. The

Parish Family Leadership Team will assess applications, host an information session for final discernment, and make the final selection.

TASKS OF THE PARISH FAMILY COUNCIL

Throughout the One Parish Plan process, the PFAC will support various efforts, including hosting listening sessions, conducting surveys, meeting with staff and groups, synthesizing input, and drafting reports. Their role will evolve across the following different phases, with key activities:

- Organizing and Kickoff
- Who Are We?
- What Do We Want to Become?
- How Do We Get There?
- What Will We Be Called?
- Assembling the One Parish Plan
- Review Process

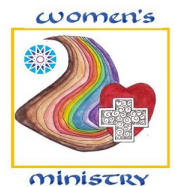
