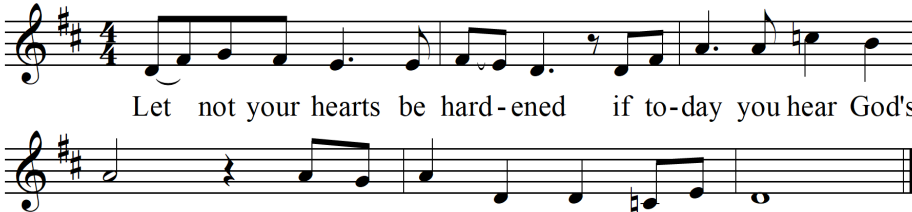
Exodus 17:3-7

The Scrutinies, are three Rites during the Period of Purification and Enlightenment as part of the OCIA process. They are intended to prepare the Elect for Baptism, focusing on self-examination, repentance, and strengthening their commitment to Christ. The Scrutinies are designed to help the Elect examine their lives, recognize their weaknesses and sins, and seek healing and purification. The focus is on God's invitation to grace and healing.

Each week Scrutiny explore themes of the gospel readings. In the first scrutiny, is about Jesus encounter with the Women at the Well, Jesus and baptism are the living water that bring us to new. During this week we ask the Elect and Candidates, *For what do you thirst? And when in your heart do you find resistance to God's fountain?* In the Second Scrutiny, Jesus heals the Man Born Blind, representing Jesus as the light of the world. During this week we ask the Elect and Candidates, *Where do you encounter blindness in your heart and in your life? Where have you come to see the face of Christ?* In the Third Scrutiny, Jesus Raises Lazarus from the Dead, illustrating Jesus as the Resurrection and the Life. During this week we ask the Elect and Candidates, *What binds your heart and keeps you from new life? How have you experienced Jesus calling you to new life?* You might want to pray with these questions yourself, to prepare your heart for Easter graces.

Every week, as the priest lay hands on them, we pray for the strength, and increase of faith, so they may be enlightened with God's Word and grace, so they are ready to join us in the Paschal Mystery at the Easter Vigil. Please join us at these different Masses and celebrate those seeking baptism and full communion in the church. As part of our commitment to transparency in our financials we want to share with you the results for the first eight months of our fiscal year. While net income from operations is consistent with the same period last year, our ordinary income (Stewardship) is down \$131,000 for the same time period. An increase in other income and lower operating expenses contributed to the bottom-line stability. However, operating expenses at this current level are **not sustainable** because three employees that left last year have yet to be replaced. We are looking strategically at replacing or adding new employees from a parish family perspective going forward, and our goal is to be very intentional in adding new staff with regard to the impact on parish finances of both parishes.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How long does Partners last?

A: There is no finite time limit for Partners in the Gospel. The consultative phase took place in 2023. Once new parish families are officially formed in July 2024, they will have three years to become one parish. While this is the target date, each parish family is unique: Some parish families may wish to become one canonical parish sooner, while others may need a bit more time.

Q: What is left of the timeline?

A: While each Parish Family is unique and has their own challenges, here is a general outline for our parish family.

July 2024: Parish family went into effect, beginning of Year 1 - "Who Are We?"

Summer 2025: Parish Family Advisory Council is established and begins their work advising our Pastoral Coordinator, Deacon Steve.

July 2025: Year 2 - "Who Do We Want to Become?"

July 2026: Year 3 - "How Do We Get There"

2027: Parish families become one canonical parish

"THE WAY OF SORROWS": A LENTEN JOURNEY TO HOPE

THURSDAY APRIL 10 6:30PM, Simple Soup Supper to follow

Similar to a year ago, the St. Joseph's Climate Justice Committee will lead the people in "The Way of Sorrows." This will take place within St. Joseph's Church.



Based on the traditional structure for the Stations of the Cross, this prayer links our current environmental situation to Jesus' suffering and death. Themes incorporate our role in Earth's devastation; environmental destruction; collapse of the most vulnerable; Earth as mother; live simply; species extinction; concerns about water, air, deforestation, fossil fuels, and climate change. From the situation of so much destruction, as we reflect on Jesus' burial, we turn our attention to seeds of hope.

The Way of Sorrows will last 30-40 minutes. Afterward the Climate Justice Committee invites participants to share a soup and bread supper (BYOB) in the Parish Center Arrupe Room. 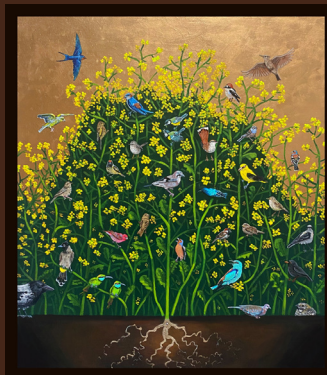
