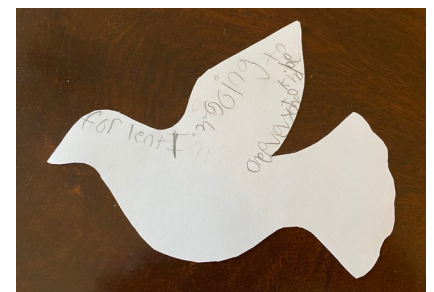
Church Easter Decorations

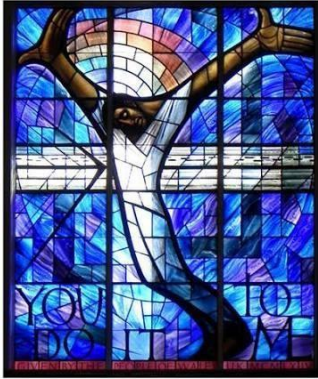

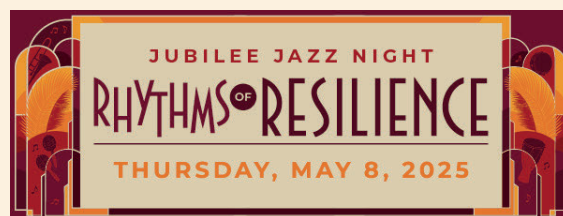
