Doc Holliday Update

Do you remember our recent letter about the Doc Holliday legacy forest?

As of last week, 78 parishioners signed this letter to Lands Commissioner Dave Upthegrove about saving this forest parcel from clear cutting. On May 6, a representative of CJC testified at the Washington State Bureau of Natural Resources monthly meeting. She called attention to St. Joseph's parishioners' letter and its contents. Mr. Upthegrove received the letter the next day.

Doc Holliday is still standing because people stepped forward, gave a voice to the forest, and demanded a pause. The goal is a better decision. All sides are now working together to find a way to both preserve a beautiful natural forest system and satisfy business commitments. Saving this forest remains a work in progress.

Thanks so much for your actions and prayers on behalf of the Doc Holliday forest. Please continue to pray as we hope a full resolution can be reached.
