Director of Pastoral Ministries

Hello Parish Family,

Our needs and responsibilities change as our four communities move closer to becoming a single Parish Family. Beginning July 1st, I will transition to the position of Director of Pastoral Ministries for our Parish Family. The DPM role is to “shepherd the overall vision for all pastoral ministries and lead the Family Pastoral Team.” These ministries include liturgy, faith formation, the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA), sacramental preparation, outreach, social justice, and evangelization. I will work closely with Deacon Steve, Theresa Shepherd-Lukasik, Meredith Wright, Fr. Mike, Fr. Phil, and all of you to provide for the pastoral needs of our entire Parish Family.



Through the Partners in the Gospel process, we have the opportunity to highlight our gifts and focus on our call to discipleship. God calls us to live our baptismal vows to be priests, prophets, and servants of God for and with one another and the wider world. As DPM, I will also serve as a liaison with the Parish Family Advisory Council keeping our purpose in the forefront of their mission to bring us together. It is with great joy and hope that I am honored to serve in this role.

I have served as Pastoral Assistant for Faith Formation, Liturgy, and Pastoral Care at St. Therese for the last six years, and in related capacities for the previous fourteen years. Children’s Catechetical Formation has been the constant in my work at St. T’s, primarily with the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, and with the students at STCA. Before my parish position, I worked in Refugee Resettlement for CCS.

I grew up on a farm outside the Tri-Cities. I then attended Gonzaga University and Boston College’s School of Theology and Ministry, where I studied Social Work and Pastoral Ministry. My husband, Jesse, and I have three children who attended/attend St. Therese Catholic Academy. Our oldest just graduated from Holy Names Academy and will begin college in the fall. In my free time, I enjoy gardening and traveling.

I look forward to getting to know more members of our Parish Family and growing in faith together.

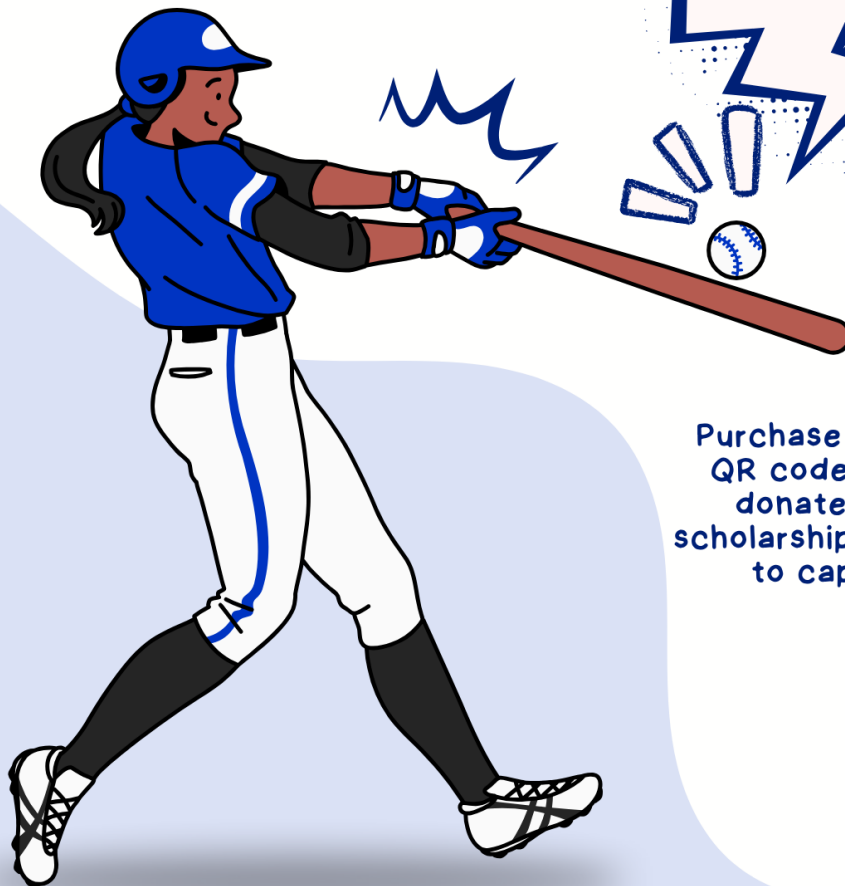
