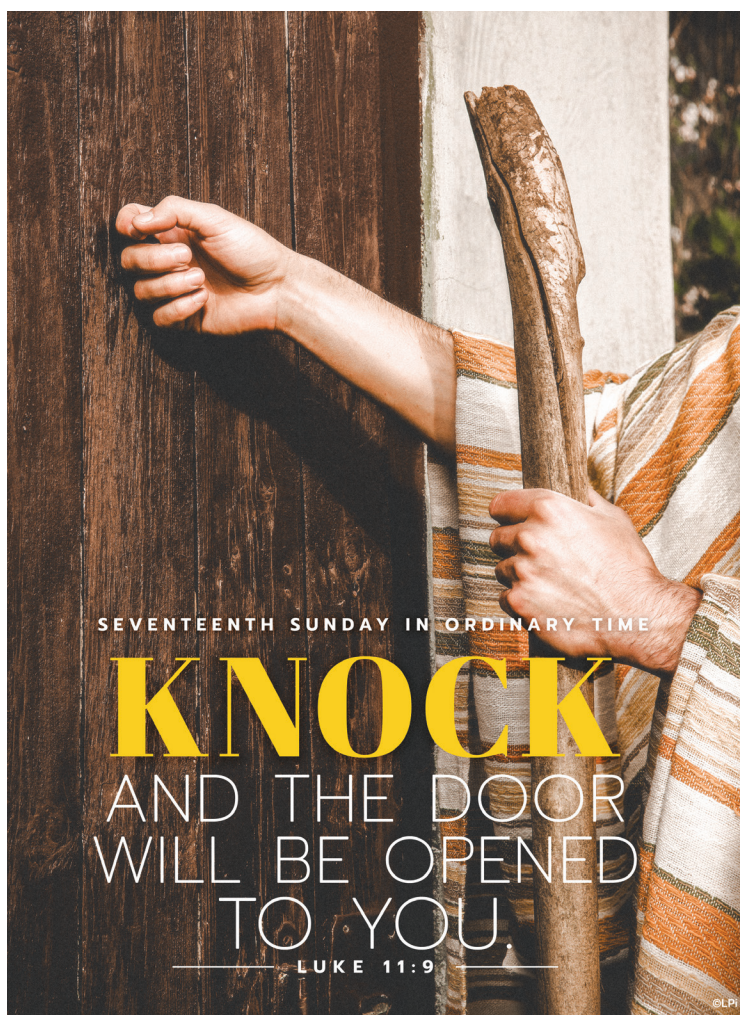

THE WEEKLY WORD

A COLUMN WRITTEN BY A MEMBER OF OUR PARISH FAMILY

Linguistics is fascinating! The way we talk to someone reveals a great deal about our culture, education, relationship, and more. Even though the apostles had certainly learned through scripture and their Jewish upbringing, in our Gospel this weekend, they ask Jesus to teach them how to pray.

Jesus began by giving them the words of the *Our Father*, a prayer that has become rote. However, this very prayer is dynamic and fluid, as Christ's subsequent parable and our other readings illustrate. Relationships depend upon both sides, and while God constantly loves us and offers forgiveness, the *Our Father* states a fundamental truth: we can only receive the love and forgiveness offered if we offer the same. In our reading from Genesis, Abraham found God's love through perseverance and advocacy for the people of Sodom. In the parable of the *Insistent Friend*, Jesus exemplifies how our neighbors will not share the bread we need if we do not ask, and we will not have the opportunity to be generous if we do not answer the knock at our door. In both stories, people had to do hard, uncomfortable things to be closer to God.

Later this week, we celebrate the feast day of St. Ignatius, co-founder of the Jesuits. Nearly 500 years after his death, his philosophy and theology continue to shape our understanding of how we perceive ourselves in relation to God and how we communicate with God. Ignatian Spirituality encourages us to free ourselves from distractions and open ourselves to God's omnipresence. When we can acknowledge that unending love given as gift to and for all people, then, to return that love, we must be in service to one another. We must take action to bring justice and peace to everyone, even if it is hard or inconvenient.

Abraham, Jesus, and Ignatius show us that human experience is not often easy. Abraham could have said nothing and let Sodom be destroyed, but then he would have suffered the grief of his nephew's death. The Insistent Friend could have chosen not to ask for food for his visitor, but then the visitor might have complained all night, or it might have ruined their relationship. The neighbor could have ignored the knocks at his door, but his children may have woken up, and all parents know that over-tired children generously share their suffering. The wisdom from these scriptures and Ignatius teaches us to seek relationship with God and to look for love even in moments that are not easy. When we pray, "deliver us from evil," we are not just asking for a forcefield to be around us, keeping bad things at bay. We are asking God to help us see the temptations and injustices in the world and to take actions that keep those terrible things from happening.

So, next time you pray the *Our Father*, know that you are asking for God's presence, but you are also committing to seek it out.

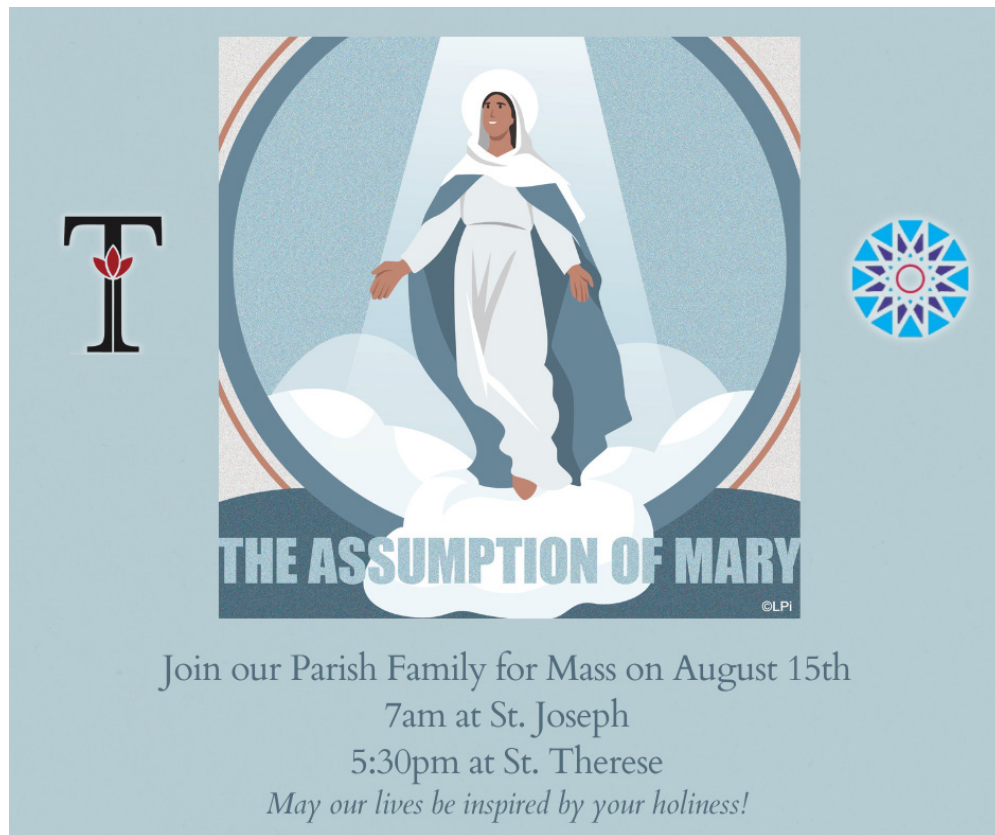

A Message from Deacon Steve

July 2025

Thank you to the 163 people from the communities of St. Joseph, St. Patrick and St. Therese who participated in listening sessions earlier this year. St. Mary has not yet conducted a listening session.

The purpose of the listening sessions was to provide each community with the opportunity to discuss their unique experiences and hopes as we move forward in the Partners in the Gospel process.

I asked an ad hoc group of people from each community to review the listening session comments, develop a summary of comments by community, and to identify common themes across all communities. That task is nearly completed and the results will be shared with parishioners, pastoral council, and Parish Family Advisory Committee (PFAC) later this summer.

The comments that emerged from these listening sessions will inform parish leadership on what's important and where to focus our attention. More parish family listening sessions will take place as we journey together to become one unified (canonical) parish. Please pray the Holy Spirit will continue to guide our work and our community.

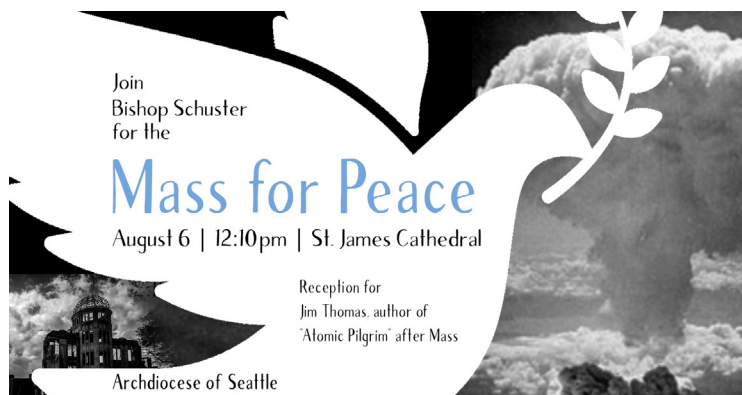

- Class will be located at St. Joseph Parish from 10:30 AM - Noon, Sundays this Fall

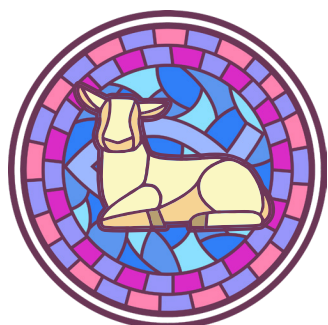
