Jenny Lobo, Co-Chair

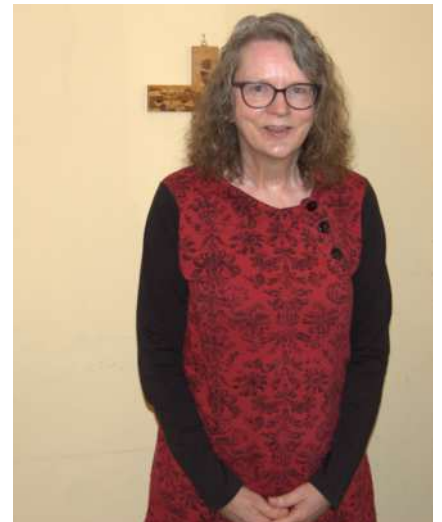

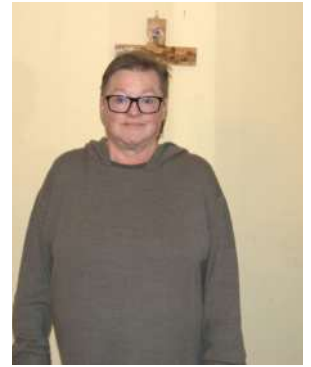


Luke Lavin, PhD

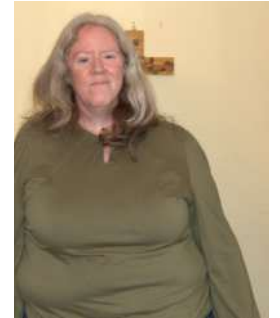
Melissa Lockhart

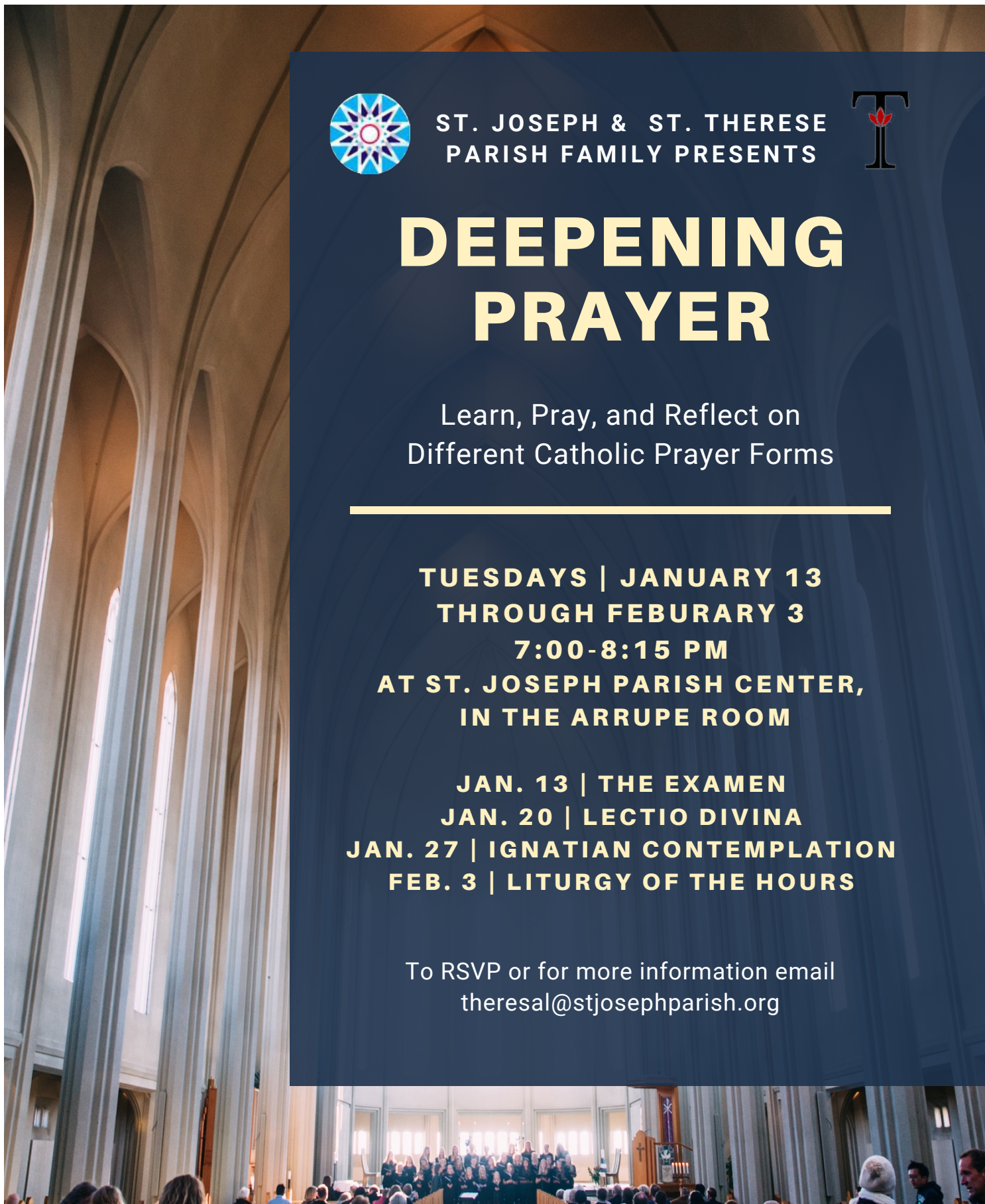
