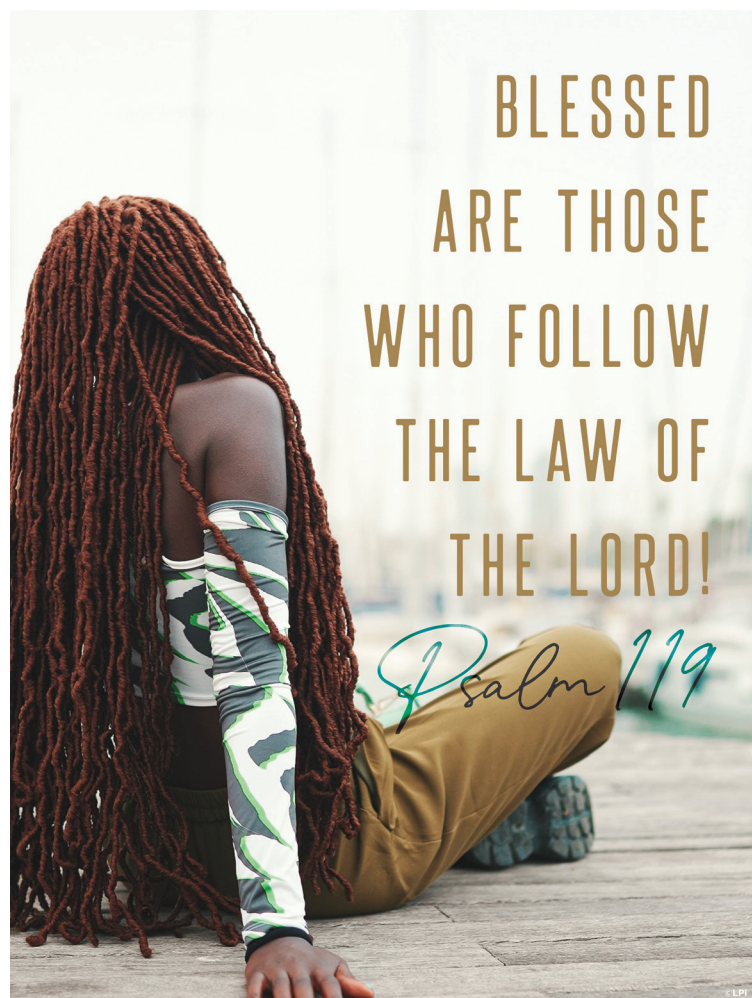

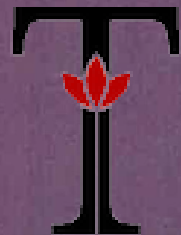

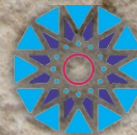

Support San Bartolome and Desarrollo Humano Popular



Desarrollo Humano Popular (DHP: Popular Human Development) is a scholarship program supporting students from the communities that comprise San Bartolome parish with higher education. The goal is to help young people receive advanced education, secure employment and be able to stay in their home country and support their communities.

St Joe's and St Pat's supported DHP from the beginning with 99 participants graduating through the program in its 25 years.

In 2025 DHP supported 23 students from communities across the parish of San Bartolome. 13 are studying for a bachelor's degree, four an engineering degree, and five a doctorate in medicine.

The program includes monthly meetings "with the aim of forming men and women with a sense of solidarity and responsibility towards the community."

St Joe's currently contributes \$13,500 to the project annually which is approximately 50% of the DHP budget. You can contribute via using the QR code below, or simply send a check in with Sister Parish noted on in.

State of St. Joseph and St. Therese Parish Family Campuses

As we continue gathering and analyzing information about our parishes through the Partners in the Gospel process, we will regularly share insights and updates. This flyer summarizes findings from a detailed inspection conducted by the Archdiocese Property & Construction team on the condition of our facilities across all four campuses (including schools). The assessments provide a starting point to help our staff and Facilities Committee prioritize maintenance and repair projects to ensure the safety and sustainability of our 23 structures.

The information below highlights key findings and provides an overview of our facilities' current conditions. These insights guide our understanding of how our properties will shape the journey toward becoming one unified parish under the Partners in the Gospel initiative. Our goal is to work together to ask the right questions and determine the highest, best use for our sites that will service our parish family and the mission of the Catholic Church.

Our facilities team has categorized needs by priority, beginning with safety concerns. For larger expenses—like roof replacements—the Partners in the Gospel process will help us discern how best to proceed. While we are addressing safety issues as promptly as possible, we recognize that the months ahead will require tough decisions about which repairs to undertake and which areas to maintain as they are.

FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS BY CAMPUS

St. Joseph

Strengths and Opportunities:

- The overall property is well maintained, with the broad variation of building age allowing for staggered financing of capital projects.
- The concrete exterior of the church is well kept and is easier to maintain than brick or stone.

Risks and Challenges:

- HVAC systems are aging in the church and school buildings; will need eventual upgrade/replacement.
- Windows in the parish center are single pane and not energy efficient.
- Some of the buildings have water running down the exteriors.
- The church and school building are subject to City and State Clean Performance Energy requirements (both Tier II buildings over 20,000sf).

St. Mary

Strengths and Opportunities:

- The school is leased by a good tenant, who is willing to invest in improvements/upgrades to the property.
- The parapet walls on the school have been seismic retrofitted.
- The location of the campus lends itself to potential redevelopment opportunities.
- School has modern fire/sprinkler system.

Risks and Challenges:

The campus buildings are recommended for further evaluation and long-term planning due to the following issues:

- The church has major structural concerns and systems at end of life. There are signs of water penetration which poses a risk and possible significant expense to repair.
- Unreinforced masonry on the church and school buildings.
- Security is an issue for both the school and church grounds due to transient individuals in the area.
- The school has aging systems with signs of water penetration.
- Some systems in the parish center building are at end of life.
- The parish center building has a rotting deck/railing and is in overall fair to poor condition.
- The school building may be subject to City and State Clean performance energy requirements – further evaluation is needed.

St. Patrick

Strengths and Opportunities:

- The lower level of the church building underwent a major renovation last year for an Early Learning Center operated by St. Joseph School, which included a new HVAC system, electrical and security upgrades.
- The church sanctuary remains consecrated, and usage is limited to liturgical events.
- Current tenant in rental house (former parish center) has expressed desire to continue leasing the house through July 2027

Risks and Challenges:

- The rental house (former parish center) and garage are in poor condition with structural concerns, failing brick and deferred maintenance.
- Systems in the rental house are old and need to be replaced (HVAC, electrical, etc.).

St. Therese

Strengths and Opportunities:

- The church has a “Hearing Loop” and ADA access at the street entrance, which makes it well suited to accommodate those with mobility and hearing issues.
- The social hall/gym and kitchen was recently renovated and upgraded.

Risks and Challenges:

- The church/school building (outside of social hall/gym) has had few updates and many of the systems in the building, including plumbing and HVAC, are old and at end of life.
- Unreinforced masonry on church/school building is likely and will need further evaluation.
- Lack of ADA restroom access in social hall/gym is an issue.
- The church has single pane windows.
- Mechanical, electrical, and storage areas under the church are not safely accessible.
- The play area for the school is across the street.
- The parish center is in poor condition with aging systems, deferred maintenance and water leakage challenges in the Atrium.
