SACRED TRIDUUM 2026



The Sacred Triduum, sometimes referred to as the Easter or Paschal Triduum, is a Latin term meaning "three days," referring to the solemn period from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. These three days, are a single liturgy, that invites us to experience: the Institution of the Eucharist, where Jesus washes his disciples feet at the Last Supper, Jesus' agony in Gethsemani, his passion, death, and resurrection marking the summit of the liturgical year. Jesus is the Paschal Lamb, and we enter into Jesus' life, death, and resurrection through the celebration of the sacraments of baptism, eucharist, and confirmation.

On Holy Thursday, April 2 at 7:00 PM at either St. Therese or St. Joseph Parish, we begin around the table of the Last Supper, where we receive the humble service of Jesus washing our feet, and we receive the wondrous gift of Jesus in the Eucharist. We then follow Jesus to the garden, and watch and pray.

On Good Friday, April 3 at 7:00 PM at either St. Therese or St. Joseph Parish, we continue with prostration and silence, in awe of Jesus great sacrifice. We hear the story of Christ's passion, we venerate the cross on which was hung our salvation. We place our sins and our wounds on the cross the brought about our forgiveness and healing, and we conclude with a communion service, with hosts consecrated the night before, as we partake in the body and blood of Christ.

On Holy Saturday, April 4, at the Easter Vigil, we started outside with the Easter fire. We process into the church, and listen to the story of salvation history. We lead the Elect through the waters of baptism, so they can die with Christ to rise with Christ to new life. Our candidates make their profession of faith, and receive the Eucharist for the first time. The elect, candidates, and confirmandi all receive Confirmation.

All of us experience suffering, and the Body of Christ continues to be crucified, in Iran, Gaza, and Ukraine. We see him in refugees, immigrants, and homeless on our streets. We see Jesus in our own lives, in the loss of loved ones, in mom's who don't have enough food to feed their children, in racism and transphobia, and in all forms of injustice; yet, we are still beloved disciples. We enter into this great mystery of love, trusting God, even when all seems hopeless, that sin and death do not have the final word.

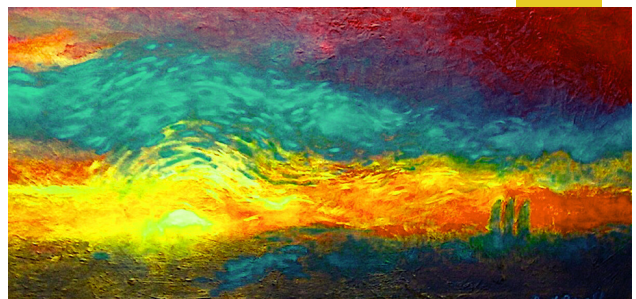
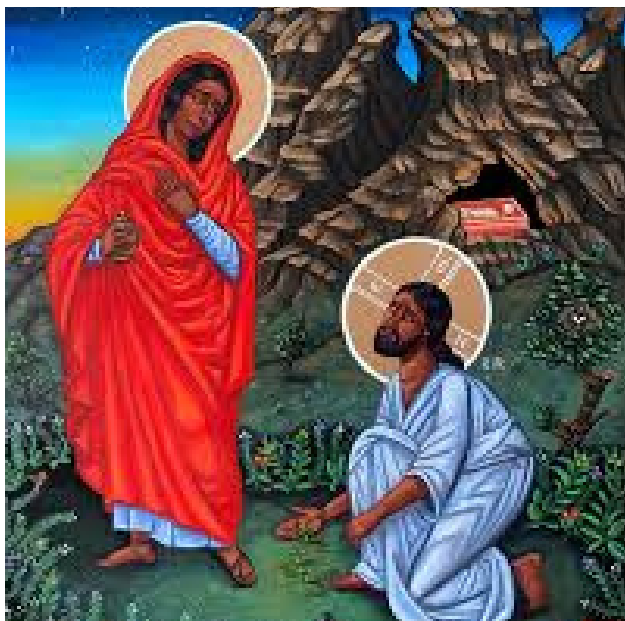

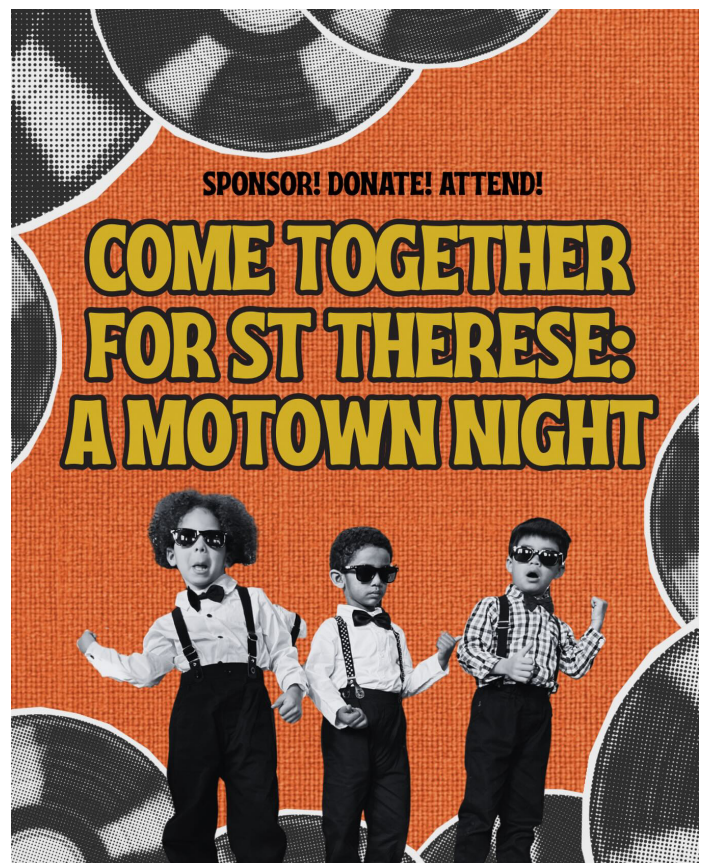
