


Doors open 20 minutes before Mass starts. Please arrive early, as attendance is limited to 125 people, and all seating will be first-come, first-seated.

First Reading

Acts 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter said to the people: "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."

CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION

Team Members Needed for Middle School Confirmation

FAITH JUSTICE

Immigration Committee: Request for Housing!

The St. Joe's Immigration Committee has been approached with a request for temporary housing for an immigrant from Pakistan.

He is in his late 30's, and fled Pakistan because he had witnessed a shooting and his life was threatened. It was a long journey to get here, and he ended up in the Tacoma detention center. He was released from detention in September 2020, has his work permit and is currently living in White Center.

He's been living in a room with a family there; however, his main support network is in the Capitol Hill area. He received his COVID vaccine recently and understands the health protocols necessary right now. He has a full-time job in Kent and speaks English.

He also has other needs, such as dental work. If you know of anyone who could provide that service pro bono or at low cost, that would also be helpful.

Nurturing Roots
