Re-Opening at St. Joe's

5pm Saturday Mass:

The Saturday 5pm Mass is now open to in-person attendees! The Mass will still be livestreamed on YouTube, but now with people in the pews. If Saturday 5pm was your usual Mass before the pandemic, or if it's simply a better time for you and your family, we invite you to join us!

Social Distancing – Closer Contact Section:

We now have a non-socially-distanced section of the church during Mass. As more and more people become fully vaccinated, many feel comfortable sitting closer to other households during Mass. The front right (south) quarter of the church is now a section that does not have social distancing guidelines. Masks are still required for everyone!

Church Open Hours:

Church open hours are returning to their normal times – Monday thru Friday, 7am – 4pm, Saturday 11am – 5pm, and Sunday 9am – 7pm (excluding regularly scheduled Masses, wedding, and funerals). There will no longer be a church attendant present, though the parish center will be staffed during normal business hours.

St. Joseph, Jesus' earthly father, is more than a man who stood next to Mary at the Nativity. After being promised to Mary he is visited by an angel and is told his betrothed is pregnant by the Holy Spirit and will give birth. Then he must look after a very pregnant Mary while travelling to Bethlehem which was about 90 miles away! It took them 4-5 days over many hills and cold weather. They'd have had to pack their own food and worry about wild animals: boars, bears, and even lions! There were also bandits and outlaws to look out for. There were many more trials for Joseph. After the shepherds and Magi bring notice to Herod that the promised Messiah has been born, Joseph must flee with his family to Egypt to keep them safe. He also had to provide as the breadwinner. That must have been a worry as they now lived in a foreign country. The questions fathers today ask themselves are the same Joseph worried about. Could he keep his family safe? Would he be able to make enough to provide for them? St. Joseph models for all fathers to work for the greater glory of God and his family.


Racial Justice Book Group





FINANCIAL UPDATE

Dear St. Joe's Community,

I have some great news to share! St. Joseph has received confirmation that our Payroll Protection Program loan was forgiven. (The PPP was a Small Business Administration program unique to the pandemic.)

I'm so thankful to have received these funds. As you can see in the below numbers, even with cutting our expenses this year by \$135,000, it would not be enough to cover the huge loss of income during the pandemic. With the PPP adjustment, we will have a \$68,000 adjusted net income. This infusion allowed us to continue to support services like food pantry, opening our kitchen to PLANET WORTH (vegan meals for houseless neighbors), our partnerships with Facing Homelessness and St. Vincent de Paul shelters, and keeping the church open daily for personal prayer. Additionally, we pivoted to online programing for prayer groups, educational events, community forums, faith formation, and confirmation. We also began a parishioner buddy system ministry that is still going strong.

I know it will take time for us to grow our income to pre-pandemic levels. Our parish had a goal of an adjusted net income of \$90,000. While we are tracking about \$25,000 short of that goal (and my comfort level for a good night's sleep!), the generosity of our community has allowed us to retain a portion of our savings to use for the next fiscal year. For this, I'm extremely grateful. My ultimate goal is to be sure our staff feels secure during this time of change and uncertainty.

We have not done a special ask during the pandemic, as we just did not feel comfortable asking during this uncertain time. We also wanted to wait to be sure we needed the funds before we asked for them. As we continue a broader opening, we are asking that you continue to remember us in gifts and prayers if you are able. We have almost made it through the pandemic together and with your help we can end this year in a better financial position.
